For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.



Okay, now triple the fear element and imagine that you have do any one of those things **without** transportation, secure shelter, employment, income, identification or the support of friends and family. Now imagine that you have children to support.

THAT is the challenge confronted by many of the men and women that are released from prison.

We are bombarded with information about the high recidivism rate for incarcerated people. But most of us lack the information we need to understand why.

If you are curious about why it is so hard for the justice-impacted population to get back on their feet, or why recidivism is so high, join us for a reentry simulation at **All Saints' Episcopal Church on November 2 from 10:00am-12noon.**

The Reentry Simulation highlights the struggles and challenges faced by individuals who are transitioning into society from incarceration. 


