Let us then offer our prayers to God for all his people, for this congregation, and for Perry their Rector.



*The Wardens may now present the keys of the church, saying*

Perry, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people.

*The Canon to the Ordinary and the Dean of the Cathedral present the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying*

Perry, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this diocese.

**People: Amen.**

*The Altar Guild of the parish presents bread and wine, saying*

Perry, take this bread and wine, and be among us to break the Bread and bless the Cup.

**People: Amen.**

*The Choir of All Saints' presents a choir cross, saying*

Perry, receive this cross, crafted by one of our own, and be among us as we craft together the music and worship in this place.

*The Head of the Day School and some students present books and pencils, saying*

In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen.**


