#### From Pastor's Pen

The book of Hebrews addresses Christians in Rome undergoing persecution sometime close to 64 AD when Christians began dying for their faith under Nero. The book is a clarion call to not return to Judaism, which was a legal religion while Christianity had become an illegal religion.

The author urges people to remain faithful to their Christian confession (Heb 3:1; 4:14; 10:23), warns against drifting away and neglecting salvation (Heb 2:1, 3), points out the danger of losing confidence in God's promises (Heb 3:6) and falling away from the faith (Heb 3:12). People were tempted to become rebellious and unbelieving like Israel (Heb 3:16–19) for they had not progressed into Christian adulthood (Heb 5:11–6:2). They had experienced God's saving gifts in Christ but may end up rejecting him (Heb 6:4–6; 10:29; 12:25). Sluggishness (Heb 6:12) could lead to something far worse—apostasy (Heb 10:26). Thus, repeatedly the author reminds people that in Christ, they have something better.

I'm therefore calling our Advent and Christmas emphasis *Something Better*. Hebrews repeatedly explains the gifts God gives Israel through Moses and then promises that we have something much better! My preaching plans are as follows:

Advent 1 "A Better Word" (Hebrews 1:1–2) Advent 2 "A Better Glory" (Hebrews 1:3a) Advent 3 "A Better Absolution" (Hebrews 1:3b) Christmas Eve "A Better Name" (Hebrews 1:4–14)

A supplement that we are purchasing for Peace members is an Advent Devotional written by one of our members, Kyle Jones. We will only have 75 copies available, due to cost, so only one per family please. It will really prepare your heart in Advent for the Christmas celebration of Christ's birth!

Our Preschool and Child Care Classes will be learning about Christmas, Advent and the story of Jesus' birth during the month of December.

The 3K students will get to make their own Advent candle to take home along with a calendar to anticipate the days until Christmas! We also read many stories about Christmas during December, both Jesus-filled and fun holiday traditions. We'll make ornaments for them to take home each week and a special baby Jesus gift for their families.

We spend much of the month preparing for our 3K Christmas program, an adorable retelling of the Nativity story based upon the Gospel of Luke. Each child has a part in the play complete with costumes and props. We invite you to join us in the church on Thursday, December 18 at 10:30 for the short program!

## Angel Tree Christmas

Can you believe that this is our 25<sup>th</sup> year helping incarcerated moms and dads get Christmas gifts to their children through Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree Program? For newer members who may not be aware, Angel Tree Christmas is a program run through Prison Fellowship, which is a national organization. Chaplains in the prison system obtain gift requests from parents who are incarcerated. Area churches, like Peace, purchase gifts and deliver them to the children's home on behalf of the parents in prison. This helps each child to know that they are not forgotten and fosters that parent child bond while they are separated.

This year we were assigned 30 local children (14 families) that we will be serving in person and we will also have access to an online portal where we can provide gifts to children in rural places that are not being served by an area church. Those children will have a gift card mailed to them along with Gospel material and a card they can send in to get a free Bible mailed to their house. There will be envelopes on the tree if you would like to donate \$30 to purchase one of these online gifts. The children that we serve in person will receive an age-appropriate Bible, Devotional or Bible story book that is a gift from our church. They will also receive one gift valued around \$30 that their

caregivers recommended. That gift is presented as coming from the parent in prison even though it is purchased and wrapped by one of the many Peace Volunteers.

If you would like to purchase a gift, please see Marilyn at the Angel Tree! Angel tags will be on the tree after each service until they are gone. Gifts need to be wrapped and returned to church by Friday December 12.

Josue worked with our team every day and Raquel would stop by after she was done with work. She is a teacher at the school which is practically next door to their new home. The kids were fun and loved to greet us with a hug. They even sang for some of us when we were on a water break!

With the team of 12 (Sara & Greg Shuler, Mark & Darcy Luling, Tom Roberson, Gary & Gretchen Barg, Carole Hetrick, Pastor Kruse, Art & Marilyn Thompson and Eric Thompson) the house went up fast and we were even able to put two coats of mud on the drywall seams and sand them too. This year we were able to provide the family with two ceiling fans courtesy of a Thrivent grant.

In the end it became a beautiful little beige house with champagne colored trim and a home that Josue and Raquel felt happy and blessed to call theirs. They both had tears in their eyes at the house blessing that took place on the last afternoon as soon as the job was done.

Typically, one of the local Lutheran pastors would come and do the house blessing but this year since we came with our own pastor, Pastor Kruse did the blessing using a translator app on his phone. It worked out quite well and we even sang Alabare to praise God for providing this wonderful Christian family with a new little home!

Since we had such a big team this year, we also decided to do a three-day VBS at the community center that is owned by Josue's mom Corinna. Sara and I taught the Birth of Christ on the first day and we taught the kids the song Alabare which means, I will praise. Day 2 was the raising of Lazarus from the dead and we taught them the song Cristo es el Fundamento or Christ is the

Foundation, which is about Jesus and Martha outside Lazarus' tomb. On the last day we taught the death and resurrection of Jesus and the song Resucito (He has risen).

All three songs were on Mariachi San Pablo's first CD and we were blessed with a wonderful translator named Aaron who just so happened to be one of Mariachi San Pablo's guitar players! He brought his guitar and helped to teach the songs to the children. Aaron is also studying to be a Pastor. He was a great blessing to us and had such a heart for the people, especially the children. He is going to be a wonderful pastor someday. We thanked God for him!

We also taught them John 3:16 as a memory verse in Spanish of course. We emphasized to the children the importance of memorizing God's word and holding it in your heart. We worked on it the first 2 days and on the third day I asked if anyone remembered the verse and to our astonishment several children raised their hands and then recited the verse. What a blessing that was to us and them!

Since we had such a good time building the home and doing the VBS, I'm pretty sure, Lord willing, we will do it again. Maybe next November since the weather was so nice. Maybe you should pray about it and see if you would like to go with us next time!
