Greetings, Peace family!

Over the past several weeks, we've had the opportunity to hear from two visioning consultants: Randy Larson from Five Two on December 14, and Jeff Meyer from Auxano on January 11.

Thank you to everyone who attended and engaged in those presentations. At our February 1 Voters' Meeting, we will vote on how to move forward with visioning. At that time, we may choose to partner with Auxano, Five Two, or to move ahead without a consultant.

Peace has not participated in a formal visioning process since 2008—nearly 20 years ago. Since then, much has changed in our lives and in the life of our congregation. Our Peace family has grown and shifted, and so have our neighborhoods, our state, and our country. These changes invite us to pause and ask thoughtful questions about where God may be leading us now.

We are grateful that Peace is experiencing organic growth and financial stability. At the same time, we're feeling some real constraints—limited space, aging facilities that need care, and the growing need for additional staff to support our ministry. As we look ahead, we want to make intentional decisions that reflect Christ's calling for our church and help us move forward with faith and purpose.

Clarifying our vision, mission, and core values will help unite us around a shared direction and common language. From there, we can develop a realistic and flexible strategic plan—one with clear milestones that allow us to measure progress and make adjustments along the way.

While Peace can't be everything to everyone, we *can* focus on our strengths, align our leadership and congregation, and move forward together in a way that honors both our current realities and our future calling.

So where is God leading us next? Let's discern that together.

Please continue to pray—for wisdom, unity, and clarity; for openness to God's will; and that whatever path we choose would deepen our faith and strengthen our commitment to sharing the love of Christ.

Evangelical Child & Family Agency

Evangelical Child & Family Agency (ECFA) is dedicated to offering compassionate, Christ-centered care to children, families, and individuals through their adoption and pregnancy support services.

Their team of trained professionals provides free, confidential, and caring support to women facing an unexpected pregnancy or those who simply need extra encouragement during their pregnancy journey. ECFA's case workers walk alongside each client, helping them work toward personal goals such as finding stable income, securing housing, connecting with community resources, and receiving essential material support. They serve parenting mothers from the beginning of their pregnancy through their baby's first six months of life. For those who choose adoption, ECFA's support continues for up to one year after the child is born.

ECFA's adoption program also offers Christ-centered guidance and support to families who feel called to grow their family through adoption. Their adoption staff helps prepare and license families while walking with them every step of their adoption journey. They currently offer services for Domestic, Interstate, International, and Embryo adoptions. Because both their adoption and pregnancy support teams are housed within the same organization, ECFA is uniquely positioned to foster healthy, respectful relationships between birth families and adoptive families.

Monetary donations help ECFA meet critical, practical needs for items that they are unable to store in large quantities, such as car seats, Pack 'n Plays, strollers, and other essential baby items. Your generosity allows them to respond quickly and effectively when a mother reaches out in need, ensuring she and her baby receive support right when it matters most.

We are busy with learning and growing this time of the year, and **registration for the 2026-27 school year is now open!** If you have a child, grandchild or friend who is looking for a high quality, faith-filled preschool or childcare program, we'd love to meet you.

We offer half day 3K, half day and full day 4K, lunch add-ons, and childcare for ages 6 weeks through 5 years. We also have a class for 2-year-old Toddlers with a Caregiver (2T class).
