January Mission Focus – MAF

<u>Mission Aviation Fellowship</u> is an organization that seeks to reach isolated people for Jesus and they have been doing it since the end of World War II.

Millions of people around the world live cut off from many of the things we take for granted, such as education, medical care, and even hearing about or experiencing the love of Jesus. The problem may be geographical barriers like jungles, mountains and deserts; or the problem may be social, political or religious barriers. In any case, isolation is a problem!

MAF's vision is to see isolated people changed by the love of Christ. They have the pilots and the flying expertise that can take people and supplies to places they could not get to without a plane.

Each year, MAF provides aviation services to more than 400 mission agencies, churches, and humanitarian organizations around the world. Without MAF, some of these organizations would be unable to reach the people they serve. Through these partnerships, MAF connects isolated people with vital services and goods while sharing the love of Christ in a tangible way.

During January, the 3K and 4K classrooms will be transformed into a Winter Wonderland. We'll have sock skating, igloo building and lots of penguin play. Our 3K classes will learn and recite familiar nursery rhymes this month. Playful language teaches important pre-reading skills.
