#### From Pastor's Pen

From obscurity to becoming the face of the Christian 'Reformation', who would ever have imagined God raising up an Augustinian monk/professor in the little town of Wittenberg to bring Christians back to the heart and core teaching of Christianity... "Justification through Faith in Christ alone."

On October 31, 1517 Martin Luther posted the 95 Thesis on the Castle Church Doors of Wittenberg, Germany to protest the church's sale of indulgences, thus starting the Reformation or <a href="Protest">Protest</a> ant movement.

No money, no good works, no human reason is able to save sinners. Only God's love for us shown in sending His Son, Jesus Christ into the world to suffer and die on Calvary's cross as humanity's substitute and bear on himself the penalty for our sins is able to save us.

Luther held onto the truth that a person receives forgiveness, and all of its blessings including eternal life, exclusively through faith. Not because faith itself is a saving work, but because the object of our faith is trusting the work and promise given to us in Jesus Christ alone. Our salvation rests in relying solely on what Christ has DONE for us.

So where does our Christian love and good works fit in? They fit in, not in our salvation, nor as saving merits before God but rather as evidence of our faith (or fruits of our faith in Jesus).

Please consider reading Romans and Galatians this October to appreciate the richness of these blessed truths in God's Word.

#### October Mission

#### **Lutheran Bible Translators Missionary Support**

Lutheran Bible Translators (LBT) partners with local leaders to create translation programs for the many communities who do not have access to God's Word in their native language. They send out missionaries that provide the resources, tools and the support local leaders need to make the Word of God more accessible than ever.

This month we would like to raise money and prayer support for Michael and Naomi Ersland and their young children. Michael and Naomi have just completed their assignment in Ghana where they spent nearly a decade working with the Komba Old Testament translation project. Komba is spoken by approximately 831,000 people and praise God, the Komba Bible is now complete. The New Testament was finished in 2014 and now they will have the full Bible translated in their own language. The Bibles will be printed shortly, and they hope to have a dedication ceremony in late fall.

The importance of Bible translation is nicely explained by one of the Komba people who said, "If the New Testament had not been translated into our language, people would still say that Christianity is for white people. Now we can hear and read and understand God's Word in Komba."

Now that the Komba translation work is done, Michael and Naomi Ersland have now accepted a call to serve in Tanzania. After a period of language and culture learning, Michael will provide training and mentoring for multiple translation teams. Naomi's management of the family, children's education, and daily life will extend beyond the house as she builds relationships and walks alongside neighbors.

Both Michael and Naomi appreciate learning from the local church as God's Word is used to celebrate life's joys and mourn life's sorrows. The Word becomes alive and active from new perspectives as language, culture, and faith interweave into a local fabric.

LBT missionaries have to nearly fully fund themselves to do this important work. We would like to help this young family out and they will certainly appreciate our prayers as well as any financial contribution. ## Ysleta Lutheran Mission Trip

Excitement is building for our trip to the US/Mexico border! We now have a team of 13 signed up for the trip that is happening the week of November 8 – 15. The Peace team includes: Greg & Sara Shuler, Mark & Darcy Luling, Tom Roberson, Lisa Groth, Carole Hetrick, Pastor Kruse, Gary & Gretchen Barg, Art & Marilyn Thompson and Eric Thompson.

We will be building a home for a family in need in the Kilometer 30 area which is on the southern outskirts of Juarez. This is the same area that we went to on our last trip in March of 2024. It is a very rural and poor place. Residents purchase their water from trucks that will fill up a tank on their property. They then use buckets to carry water into the house for their daily use. Juarez is a high desert area and gets less than 9 inches of precipitation a year with most of that occurring in July and August. It is a difficult life and we pray that the little house (12 ft by 24 ft) we build will be a true blessing to the family.

We have not yet been given the biographical info on the family, but you can pray for them now as we know that God knows who they are. We pray that they will experience God's love in a new and powerful way and that we can truly be the hands and feet of Jesus as we serve.
