Ministry Council Report

He is Risen – He is Risen Indeed!

How often have we heard those words? And yet they are as fresh and exciting as ever.

We are now blessed with having Pastor Kruse as our Spiritual Leader – something we had not even anticipated when the Council met last November. What a blessing!!

It has been a long time since I have reported on the operational activities of the Council. So now seems to be a good time. As mentioned, the Council met most recently in November (wow, that was a long time ago!!) At that meeting we took a look at projects that had been underway and those which had yet to be funded.

The biggest underway project was the upgrading of our video recording system in church. The old system was no longer meeting our needs, and, in fact, was made up of Tom Halverson's own equipment. The cost was around \$10,000 and was covered by our technology fund.

Also recently completed was the addition of a new playground playset for the older kids in the Preschool. These playsets can run over \$40,000. So, we were really happy to be able to get one on sale in late fall for \$15,000. Half of this amount was funded from operations and half funded from contributions from Little Lambs parents and from church members. As I write this we are almost there – a bit less than \$2000 to go.

One new project that was approved at our meeting was the installation of a handrail leading from the North parking lot to the church entrance. This will cost around \$16,000 – part of which is funded from direct contributions to the project and part from the building fund. Look for this to be completed very soon.

Future projects that are either "on the board" or in the planning stage are:

An update to the alarm system which informs us in the event of a power outage, fire, flood, break in, etc. The current system is flawed and outdated. We do not know the cost of this system but are awaiting an estimate.

We also have four HVAC units that are nearing the end of their useful lives and will need replacement. The cost for this project is around \$40,000.

One of the challenges (opportunities) we face is the use of space. We have so many vital and vibrant ministries at Peace – Little Lambs, Bible Classes, Sunday School, Quilters, Youth Group, that we are running out of space.

We presented this quandary at the recent Voters Meeting, and I was elated that the congregation, instead of taking the road of deciding which ministries would get more space and which not, chose to explore possible expansion of our space — what a blessing. While this is still in the beginning stages of planning, I was able to find the old blueprints that did show, as an option, the addition of three new meeting rooms adjacent to the northeast corner of Founders Hall. Stay tuned for more on this project!!

Our financial results for 2023-2024 remain positive. It is amazing how greatly contributions fluctuate from month to month. One month is \$7000 behind the prior year and the next \$11,000 ahead of the prior year.

As of the end of January, the monthly contributions are about \$1300 ahead of the prior year – so not a lot, but still ahead. Receipts from all church sources are at \$209,497 this year vs \$210,597 last year (includes misc. accounts).

The Preschool receipts are \$302,176 vs \$296,273 last year. Expenses are about even -- \$439,900 this year vs \$444,259 last year.

However, it should be noted that the Council also approved taking \$100,000 to pay down what amounted to almost a third of the mortgage on the building. The current balance is around

\$264,000, while the current value of the property is estimated at a bit under \$2.2 million.

One topic that has been on our minds a great deal is the state of volunteering at Peace. We have many people who are currently serving in a variety of roles.

However, we have two Boards which were enacted by the Constitution last June that have still not been filled: Trustees and Stewardship. We are actively seeking at least three volunteers for each of these boards.

Also, while we have a number of people who have volunteered to serve as ushers or sacramental ministers, we often have vacancies at a given service. One of the challenges is that the use of Signup Genius is not understood by many, and many do not even have access to it. So, perhaps we will be heading to a blend of using Signup Genius and a parallel system whereby holes in the schedule will be filled by assignment. We are still working out the wrinkles on this.

So...in the end Peace continues to be blessed by our Lord in many, many ways – our ministries, our volunteers, our financial resources. Let us always be mindful of those blessings and the greatest Blessing of All – His sending of our Savior – our <u>Risen</u> Savior.


