MILWAUKEE ARCHDIOCESE

Up-date on Human Trafficking:

February is the peak season for Human Trafficking mainly because of the Super Bowl. More than 200 "pimps" in Milwaukee have had contact with law enforcement. "Pimps" train the next generation, passing information onto their sons & nephews. Milwaukee is among the top 3 cities nationwide because of poverty, homelessness & unemployment. "Pimp" round tables are formed to learn new practices & find out ways to get around law enforcement. "Pimps" earn \$500,000 per year per girl; each "pimp" has 4-6 girls in his "stable." 92% of people who are trafficked are female; 78% are African American, with the starting age being 13.
