





Eucharistic Adoration

Every Friday, from the end of daily Mass until 1:00 pm, there is Adoration. Eucharistic Adoration is one of the most beautiful forms of prayer. Because Adoration requires that someone is always present, we are registering individual adoration with 30-minute slots. Contact Jess in the parish office to set up a time.

Eucharistic Ministers

Eucharistic Ministers are needed for all Masses. This is an excellent way to serve the Lord while attending Mass.

Ministers of the Eucharist must be fully initiated members of the Church; that is, they must have received the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Holy Communion, and be in good standing. They assist the priest in the distribution of the Holy Body and Blood to the assembly.

At the end of Mass, they aid in removing the vessels and other items from the sanctuary and return them to the sacristy. The ministers will purify, wash and return the vessels to their proper place in the sacristy. If interested, call the Parish office.

New Schedule for Weekday Masses**

As you know, Wednesday to Friday weekday Masses were moved to 10:00 AM during the pandemic. Instead of going back to the previous schedule, which does not seem to make much sense anymore in this community, we are going to move the start of Mass to 9:00 AM, beginning Thursday, June 9 (June 8 is the last school Mass of the year). There is no change to the Tuesday Mass time, which is at 6:00 PM.

Join us on Tuesday Evening for Mass at 6:00 pm with Taizé music. Taizé (pronounced: tay-zay) is a prayerful form of music known for its simple, yet rich and meditative character. Taizé music often takes the structure of an ostinato (a simple melody that repeats over and over) and is meant to serve as a kind of musical centering prayer.

Trustee Election — 4th Notice

Any parish in the Archdiocese is a corporation, whose directors are the Archbishop, as President, two vice-presidents, Auxiliary Bishop Haines, and the Pastor, and two trustees elected by the parish membership—a Trustee-treasurer and a Trustee-secretary. After eight years of very faithful and effective service on Finance Council, three of those years as Trustee-Secretary, Shawn Olley is stepping down at the end of this fiscal year, June 30.

As the parish is a legal and canonical corporation, canonical and civil law is followed for electing a new trustee. Nominations for Trustee will be accepted during a four week period. A trustee must be Catholic; a registered, practicing parish member; and at least 25 years old. The pastor has a right to nominate a candidate, and Fr. Ricardo has nominated Patrick McCauley. Additional candidates must be nominated in writing by 10 or more registered parish members. Nominations should be submitted to the Parish Office to the attention of Elizabeth Hoff, our Trustee-Treasurer.

Trustee Responsibilities: The trustee serves on the Parish Council and Finance Committees; reviews all financial reports/budgets and is responsible for accurate representations; signs off on checks for the operation of the Church as well as other documentation as required by the archdiocese; and serves as an advisor to Father Ricardo as needed. The trustee will serve at least a two-year term.

Daily Prayer Versus Mass?

Question:

I have a friend who says she doesn't need to attend Mass because she prays to God every day. What are your thoughts on this justification?

Answer:

If the only reason for going to church were to talk to God, your friend might be right. Prayer is not something limited to a physical place or even a holy place. If the sole purpose of the Church were prayer, it would be a narrow purpose indeed. The Church is a community of believers, formed by “one Lord, one faith, one Baptism.” It is an outward sign of our faith in God instituted by Christ, and the purpose of the Church is to give us grace, that is, a share in God's life.

Coming to Mass is not really for God's sake, but for ours. If we believe that Jesus is truly present in the holy Eucharist, then we will want to be in his presence. We will want to be fed by him. Our daily prayer and good works are strengthened by our authentic encounter with our Lord. For Catholics, it is at Mass that we celebrate the source and summit of our faith. If this is true, why would we ever stay away?
