CoVID Measures in Place

- Masks are optional at all Masses. We recommend that people follow the CDC's updated guidelines, which state that those who are fully vaccinated "no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance in any setting, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance." There is enough space for people to move around if they are not comfortable with masked/unmasked people around them.
- We are going to keep social distancing measures by still using every other pew (we really do not need all the pews to assume our normal Mass attendance) and by still having the ministers distribute communion in the pews.
- We are discontinuing on-line registration for Masses.
- We will keep a basket at the back of the church for the collection.
- In addition to the weekly Friday cleaning, we will clean and disinfect the church between the 8 AM and 10 AM Masses on Sunday.
- We will continue live-streaming all our Weekday Masses and the 10 AM on Sunday on Facebook Live, YouTube and on our website.

Monthly Saint Vincent de Paul Food Collection

We are returning to monthly food collection for the St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry. Our volunteers are thankful for your support of the pantry. However, over the last two months, those numbers have increased once more.

School Backpacks and School Supplies

Backpacks and school supplies are needed for homeless/transient/foster students who are currently enrolled or coming to Racine Unified School District. These students are either in the foster care system, or became homeless due to job loss, medical bills, home eviction, parent imprisonment or death, family tragedies, or the loss of school supplies through fire, theft or bullying. It is a fact that more than 60% of RUSD students and families fall below the federal poverty standards. Last school year, the Families in Transition Program handed out more than 250 backpacks and supplies to these students in need. Donations will be taken up until Wednesday, September 1. There is also a need for play-doh, disinfectant wipes, sandwich and gallon storage bags and small and large paper plates and Kleenex. We also accept monetary donations, which can be done by writing a check to Sacred Heart indicating “school supplies” in the memo.
