
Deacon Ed's Ministry

Fr. Juan's Corner

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters:

We are in Palm Sunday; we begin the journey into the Last Week of Jesus' life before his glorious moment of the Resurrection. This week is bracketed between two joyful moments: first, the triumphal entrance of Jesus in Jerusalem, and second, the joyful Resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday. In between these two joyful moments, there will be a variety of emotions and events that we must experience throughout the week.

With the triumphant entrance of Jesus in Jerusalem, people expected that the Reign of God had begun. Those who felt that the reign was coming to fruition were the humble and simple people who had experienced healing, feedings, liberating moments from evil spirits, and a promise of hope. The religious authorities were skeptical and suspicious of the great moment of glory this Galilean was having. For the humble, the Reign of God was becoming a reality, and they were overjoyed, but for the religious authorities, this movement was getting out of hand. As we know, this triumphant moment didn't last long. Soon after Jesus entered Jerusalem, the leadership began to plot against him, which resulted in the tragic death on the cross on Good Friday. The days leading to Good Friday were filled with emotional moments within the followers. One betrayed Jesus. Another denied him. Others fled from the tragic situation. But a handful of the faithful remained to witness the cross. After the cross, anguish and uncertainty become the running feeling for Jesus' followers before the glorious moment of the Resurrection.

I invite you to explore and experience this Holy Week with a solemn, prayerful approach. I know we are all busy and worried about many things (e.g., tax season), but allow yourself some time to accompany the Lord in his final week. Take time to participate in the liturgies in the Family of Four Parishes. Today, we process with the palms and chanting Hosanna to the King. Imagine for a moment the feeling of the humble people who followed Jesus from Galilee upon entering the big city of Jerusalem. If you were there, what would your reaction be? If you were there being pushed by the masses trying to get a glimpse of this humble man riding a donkey, what would you tell the people?

This week, we will post a daily reflection on our social media to spark your desire to pray and meditate. This will be a small text inviting us to reflect on the happenings of Jesus' last days. Please check our Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok for these short messages. I also invite you to participate in the Sunrise Mass that we will be celebrating on Easter Sunday at 6.15 AM across from DeKoven Center. Join me and many others in celebrating the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Blessings,
