WHEREAS, Safe Environment Week is for every parish and school, as well as the entire faith community to focus, at the same time, on the importance of keeping our children and youth safe;

WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect are societal problems whose prevention depend on involvement among people throughout the faith community;

WHEREAS, our children are our most valuable resources and will shape the future of not only the Archdiocese of Milwaukee but also the entire Church;

WHEREAS, the theme for this years' Safe Environment Week will be "Protecting our Children starts with working as a Community on Prevention.";

WHEREAS, acknowledging that as a Church we have much work to do to rebuild the trust that has been broken; WHEREAS, we acknowledge that as bishops, clergy and church leaders we must work together as a community to increase awareness about child abuse and neglect and work to promote the social and emotional well-being of children, youth and families in a safe, healthy and nurturing environment;

Fr. Juan's Corner

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters,

Greetings from Ephesus! Our pilgrimage is going very well. The scriptures of the Acts of the Apostles and Letters of Paul are gaining a deeper meaning for all of us. I hope you have followed our pilgrimage on Facebook and YouTube. We have been posting videos and reflections from each of the stops that we are making. I am grateful to Lena for working extra hours to make this available for all of us to enjoy. This is a pilgrimage for the whole Family of Four Parishes.

Let me share with you the origin of this pilgrimage. While I was in prayer a year ago, days after receiving the news that I would become the pastor of Sacred Heart, I thought I needed to do something meaningful and significant to build community amongst the people of the four parishes. It became evident to me in prayer that a pilgrimage would help me achieve that. Why a pilgrimage? A pilgrimage is a journey to a sacred place or site with a special meaning or connection to one's faith. In this case, the early churches have a special meaning for all of us who want to be disciples of Christ. I considered our four parishes the first communities and their desire to be one in Christ.

A pilgrimage can be a source of grace, inspiration, and renewal for Catholics who seek to grow closer to God. They can also be a witness of faith and solidarity to the world. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Pilgrimages evoke our earthly journey toward heaven and are traditionally extraordinary occasions for renewal in prayer" CCC 2691. This pilgrimage answered my prayer to build unity and community in the Family of Four Parishes. So, I thought of the early churches and Saint Paul. I also thought it would be great to do it at Easter so that the Sacred Scriptures for this holy season will have greater meaning for us. So, with that in mind, I organized the pilgrimage to walk in the steps of Saint Paul and visit places that the early disciples founded, as we hear in the Acts of the Apostles. In preparation for this pilgrimage, we did three open sessions to prepare biblically and spiritually for this journey.

As we discern the will of God for us in Racine, in the new restructuring of the Church, the Holy Spirit calls us to go to the sources of our Christian roots and the small communities founded by the early disciples. These communities had no buildings or structure; they were Spirit-filled communities that gathered around the table of the Lord to share the Lord's Supper. The disciples came as a family to worship Christ and to celebrate in his memory. This lack of monolithic structures helped them move from one place to another, and they invited many to participate in Christ.


One thing that becomes evident when one walks in Paul's footsteps is the versatility of the communities he founded. Racine is a fertile ground for us to return to the sources of the early church and replicate the vibrant communities who gathered around the table of Christ, worshiped the Lord, and evangelized without ceasing. I believe that Paul could help us in our journey in Racine. Paul's understanding of the church as a family, community, and body can help us overcome parochialism in our community. I pray that this pilgrimage and the sharing after we return will bring a sense of renewal within our communities, a more profound commitment to evangelization, and a greater resolve to build vibrant communities that overcome all boundaries.
