At Sacred Heart, and in Family Faith Formation, we believe and profess that:

- Parents are the principal and first educators of their children. (CCC, 1653)
- The Christian home is the place where children receive the first proclamation of the faith. For this reason the family home is rightly called "the domestic church," a community of grace and prayer, a school of human virtues and of Christian charity. (CCC, 1666).
- The Christian family constitutes a specific revelation and realization of ecclesial communion ... it can and should be called a *domestic church*. It is a community of faith, hope, and charity. (CCC, 2204)
- The Christian family is a communion of persons, a sign and image of the communion of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. In the procreation and education of children it reflects the Father's work of creation. It is called to partake of the prayer and sacrifice of Christ. Daily prayer and the reading of the Word of God strengthen it in charity. (CCC, 2205)
