# From Pastor Mary Ann

Back in New York, about this time of year, when the highs were above freezing and the lows below freezing, the sun is strong enough to pull the sap up out of it's winter storage in the tree roots. That sap is food. The tree lives because of it. SOMEone, probably by accident, found out that we could tap those maples, and take a share of the tree's sap for ourselves. Fresh from the tree it's barely sweet, but boiled down (a 5 gallon pail makes one pint of syrup) it's really a special spring treat.

In Lent, the same God who made maple trees is available to us. Like the warming sun, our prayers in Lent, draw up new fresh experiences of God in our lives. Like the process of tapping trees and gathering and reducing the sap, when we follow our Lenten disciplines, we participate in God's Spring Gift. Lent means Spring. We awaken to God's new Life, physically, and spiritually and mentally.

Maple sap can't be harvested all year round, only in that special window of time. So, too, our relationship with God has this special time in which we can be restored and enlivened. It's not too late to observe the season, and to have a holy Lent. Pray. Give. Attend to the Presence of God. Serve each other. Open your life to God's life.
