^{2:17} You have made the Lord tired with your words. You say, "How have we made him tired?" When you say: "Anyone doing evil is good in the Lord's eyes," or "He delights in those doing evil," or "Where is the God of justice?"

^{3:1} Look, I am sending my messenger who will clear the path before me; suddenly the Lord whom you are seeking will come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you take delight is coming, says the Lord of heavenly forces. ² Who can endure the day of his coming? Who can withstand his appearance? He is like the refiner's fire or the cleaner's soap. ³ He will sit as a refiner and a purifier of silver. He will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. They will belong to the Lord, presenting a righteous offering. ⁴ The offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in ancient days and in former years. ⁵ I will draw near to you for judgment. I will be quick to testify against the sorcerers, the adulterers, those swearing falsely, against those who cheat the day laborers out of their wages as well as oppress the widow and the orphan, and against those who brush aside the foreigner and do not revere me, says the Lord of heavenly forces. ⁶ I am the Lord, and I do not change; and you, children of Jacob, have not perished.



The *Children's Bell Choir*, for ages Kindergarten through 2nd grade, is a place where children will learn the fundamentals of music in a fun group environment! The


Children's Bell Choir meets from 6 to 6:30 p.m. during DuluthKids time.



Happy Sacks: Helping Children in Our Community

A growing number of school children in our community rely on free and reduced priced meals at school for their main daily meals. However, there may not be enough food to go around over the weekend. The goal of the **Happy Sacks** mission outreach



program is to provide healthy snacks for school children over the weekend. We pack approximately **150** Happy Sacks each week, which are then delivered to the schools on Friday, and given out by the school counselors to the appropriate children.

For the 2024-25 school year, we packed and delivered **4,943 Happy Sacks**. Since the program began in the Fall of 2012, we have delivered **40,044 Happy Sacks** to children in our community. The need continues to grow as does the cost of filling the bags. The **Happy Sacks** program is not a part of the church's regular budget, so we depend on your donations.

As we get ready to begin our 14th year of the **Happy Sacks** program, please consider picking up a few extra items the next time you're at the store or making a financial donation to support the **Happy Sacks** ministry.
