

Happy Sacks: Helping Children in Our Community


A growing number of school children in our community rely on free and reduced priced meals at school for their main daily meals. However, there may not be enough food to go around over the weekend. The goal of the **Happy Sacks** mission outreach



program is to provide healthy snacks for school children over the weekend. We pack approximately **150 Happy Sacks each week**, which are then delivered to the schools on Friday, and given out by the school counselors to the appropriate children.

For the 2024-25 school year, we packed and delivered **4,943 Happy Sacks**. Since the program began in the Fall of 2012, we have delivered **40,044 Happy Sacks**

to children in our community. The need continues to grow as does the cost of filling the bags. The **Happy Sacks** program is not a part of the church's regular budget, so we depend on your donations.

- \$7.00 for salad bar only, which includes the salad bar, a choice of baked potato or sweet potato, dessert and a drink.

Operation Christmas Child is Underway

Operation Christmas Child, our annual participation in Samaritan's Purse's mission for God's children around the world, is underway. In 2024, Samaritan's Purse delivered over 11.9 million shoeboxes in over 170 countries and territories, and since the beginning of the program in 1993, over 232 million shoeboxes have been delivered. By filling shoeboxes with toys, school supplies and hygiene items, you not only give to children in need the only gift they will likely receive for Christmas, but also deliver hope, joy and the gospel of Jesus Christ to them and their families.

Many children who receive these shoeboxes gifts will also be enrolled in **Operation Christmas Child's** 12-lesson discipleship program, **The Greatest Journey**, with over 5.5 million children participating last year. Children learn about God's amazing love and what it means to faithfully follow Jesus Christ.

Empty shoeboxes are available in the Veterans Memorial Gathering Room, in the hallway near Hinton Hall, and outside of room F145, located on the 1st floor of the Sheldon Family Life Center. Each box includes ideas on how to pack a shoebox, what not to include, and an adhesive label. A \$10 processing donation for each shoebox you take and fill covers the processing and shipping of the shoebox and shipping, as well as supporting training and materials for The Greatest Journey activities. The adhesive label allows you to register your shoebox(s), make your donation, and track your shoebox on-line. Completed shoeboxes need to be returned to the Veterans Memorial Gathering Room, the Dorothy L. Rainey Fellowship Hall stage, in Hinton Hall, or outside room F145 no later than Sunday, November 16th.

If you prefer to "fill a shoebox" online, there is a special website for you to use. The cost of the **Build Online Shoebox** option is \$30 per online shoebox, and you can also include **The Greatest Journey** materials for an additional \$6. There are two online options: build the shoebox yourself by selecting items to be included in the shoebox, or select the option where the shoebox is built by Samaritan's Purse. Please scan the QR code located to the right with your smartphone or tablet to complete your shoebox online. You can also find a link to fill out a shoebox online by going to the church's website - **duluthumc.org** - clicking on the **MINISTRIES** tab and then clicking on the **MISSIONS** tab.



Online shoeboxes are delivered to certain locations with special customs and cultural needs. Take-home instructions for online shoeboxes can also be found at the Operation Christmas

Child tables. This year we hope to fill 80 online shoeboxes. The deadline to complete online shoeboxes is Friday, December 19th.

Operation Christmas Child is a worthwhile and fun project for our Sunday School classes, Women's Circles, Youth Group, and families with their children to undertake. Let's try to better Duluth First UMC's total of 160 boxes we packed last year!
