

As we move into the Christmas season, we are reminded that another year is coming to a close. The Finance Office of the church is ready to assist you with your year-end giving! There's still time to make a gift of stock—you may contact Benjamin Rah via e-mail at **brah@duluthumc.org** or call the church at 770-476-3776, ext. 120. All stock transactions must be completed no later than Wednesday, December 31, 2025, in order to receive tax credit.

If you're over 72 years old, year-end giving is a great opportunity to have your Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA contributed directly to the church also. It's a win-win. When you contribute your RMD that way, you save money by paying no taxes on it, and the church gets the full use of your gift because the church pays no tax on it, either.

As stipulated by IRS regulations, the church will be able to give year 2025 contribution credit (for tax



purposes) for all donations received or post marked by December 31, 2025. The church office will be closed from Wednesday, December 24<sup>th</sup>, through Friday, January 2<sup>nd</sup>.

We will also receive donations on Sundays, December 21st and 28th, at all of our morning worship services (8:30 Traditional, 11:00 Contemporary, 11:00 Traditional), as well on Wednesday, December 24th, at our Christmas Eve services (noon, 4:00 and 6:00 p.m.) You may also mail your donations.
