Children's Message

^{3:1} Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness and came to Mount Horeb, the mountain of God. ² There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. ³ Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight and see why the bush is not burned up." ⁴ When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." ⁵ Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." ⁶ He said further, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.

⁷ Then the Lord said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, ⁸ and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land to a good and spacious land, to a land flowing with milk and honey, to the country of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. ⁹ The cry of the Israelites has now come to me; I have also seen how the Egyptians oppress them. ¹⁰ Now go, I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people, the Israelites, out of Egypt." ¹¹ But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" ¹² He said, "I will be with you, and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain."

¹³ But Moses said to God, "If I come to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" ¹⁴ God said to Moses, "I am who I am." He said further, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'I am has sent me to you.' " ¹⁵ God also said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'The Lord, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you': This is my name forever, and this my title for all generations.

^{4:1} Then Moses answered, "But look, they may not believe me or listen to me but say, 'The Lord did not appear to you.' " ² The Lord said to him, "What is that in your hand?" He said, "A staff." ³ And he said, "Throw it on the ground." So he threw the staff on the ground, and it became a snake, and Moses drew back from it.

¹⁰ But Moses said to the Lord, "O my Lord, I have never been eloquent, neither in the past nor even now that you have spoken to your servant, but I am slow of speech and slow of tongue."

¹² Now go, and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you are to speak." ¹³ But he said, "O my Lord, please send someone else." ¹⁴ Then the anger of the Lord was kindled against Moses, and he said, "What of your brother Aaron, the Levite? I know that he can speak well; even now he is coming out to meet you, and when he sees you his heart will be glad. ¹⁵ You shall speak to him and put the words in his mouth, and I will be with your mouth and with his mouth and will teach you what you shall do.

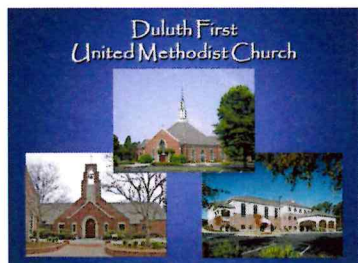

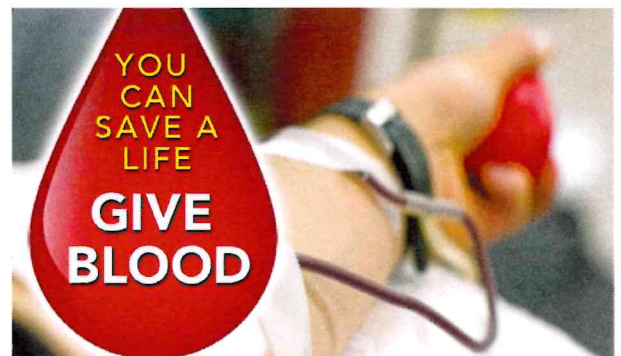


Blood Drive at Duluth First UMC on Wednesday, August 12th

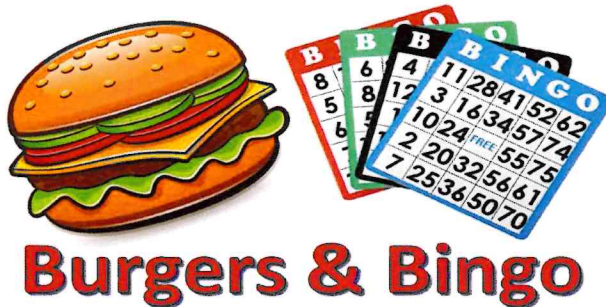

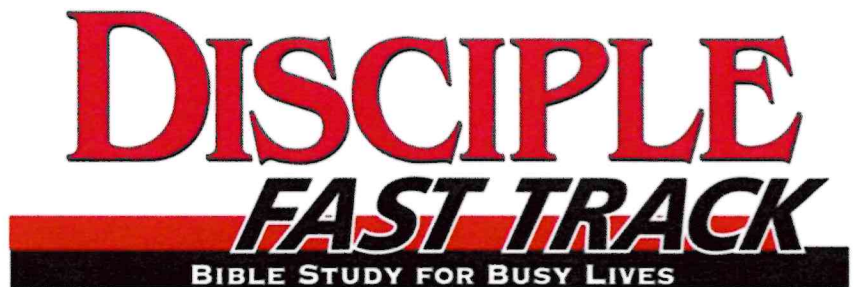

Disciple Fast Track Bible Study Begins August 19th

Join us on Wednesday evenings, beginning August 19th, for 12 weeks of studying the Old Testament with **Disciple Fast Track**, an overview of the books of the Bible in a shortened study. Have you wanted to learn more about the substance of the Bible but could not commit to a long-term study with lots of reading during the week? Does thirty-four weeks of study seem like an eternity? Your body just cannot sit through a 2 ½ hour class no matter how good it is? This new format for **Disciple Bible Study** is perfect for busy people. It uses much of the content of the original **Disciple Bible Study**, a small group study that has made a difference in thousands of lives since 1987. We are scheduling the sessions to fit a time when your youth are also involved in their activities and childcare is available for younger children.

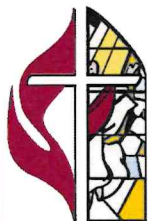

Report from the 2026 Annual Conference of the North Georgia Conference of The United Methodist Church

The 2026 Annual Conference of the North Georgia Conference of The United Methodist Church convened in Athens at the Classic Center on June 18th through 20th. Duluth First United Methodist Church was represented by 5 clergy and 5 lay delegates. Bishop Robin Dease opened the conference by preaching on the scripture theme, Matthew 25:40 – Unto the Least of These. She recounted an experience in Washington when she had been pickpocketed on her way into town. When she realized she had no money to get home, she began to ask strangers for help – just a dollar. Most all passed her by, until a homeless man came forward and gave her a dollar, telling her to get herself home. She urged members to remember those who are overlooked in society – the least of these. This powerful message set the stage for several more messages from a variety of clergy reminding us that we have a mission to help “the least of these”.

Day 1 included a welcome to Athens by the Southeast District Superintendent, the President of the University of Georgia, and the mayor of Athens-Clark County.

This year marks the 70th year since women were given full clergy rights in our denomination.

The Housing & Homeless Council has awarded approximately \$6 million in grants to churches in 72 counties in the conference.

We learned of the disparity in clergy salaries and were urged to dig deep to address this problem.

Murphy-Harpst Children’s Center lost a beloved member, Gary MacDonald, this year. They have implemented a new therapy called MindVox to help its clients with great success.

The One Georgia Report was presented for a vote to approve the unification of the North and South Georgia UMC Conferences into one Georgia Conference. A vote approved this motion by 96%. A combined committee will continue working to merge our 2 conferences into one.

New Licensed Local Pastors, Provisional Member and Full Connection Elders were introduced and challenged serve faithfully, saying, “the church puts a stole around your shoulders, but Jesus puts a towel in your hands”, referring to Jesus washing his disciples’ feet.

An offering of over \$3,000.00 for the Ministerial Education Fund was collected.

Day 2 – After a morning devotion by Rev. Sharon White, the Conference heard reports from Council on Finance and Administration (CFA) presenting a budget which will be amended as a result of unification and a modest increase in the apportionment budget.

The Barnes Evaluation & Administration Team (BEAT) approved 12 applications for church projects this year, totaling \$636,697.00.

The Disaster Response reported on the work done in the Augusta area after the hurricane which is still ongoing.

United Methodist Men & Scouting Ministry is sponsoring a retreat in August at Dauset Trails Nature center in Jackson.

United Women in Faith (UWF) reported a season of unstoppable growth. UWF is helping women by connecting, serving and leading.

Clergy and Lay retirees were recognized and thanked, including our former district Superintendent, Dana Everhart.

A service of remembrance honored those who have passed away this past year.

The Annual Conference special offering of over \$12,700.00 goes to the Center for Clergy Excellence's International Fund to help those serving in far-away places.

It was the business of the conference to elect lay & clergy delegates and alternates to both Jurisdictional and General Conferences. Much voting was required to complete this task.

A number of Boards and Committees gave reports on their progress this year. Members of the Conference approved the Resolution on Voting Rights and Encouraging Civic Engagement.

Eleven churches were presented for closure, including The Fountain, formerly housed in the Sugarloaf facility in Duluth.

Day 3 - More reports including the Episcopacy Comm., North GA Camp & Retreat Ministries, a survey conducted by COSROW of women clergy in the conference, the Georgia United Methodist Foundation, the Frances Asbury Award given to Rev. Dr. Adam Daniels and the Marian Wilder award given to Oak Grove UMC, Wesley UMC Evans, and Madison 1st UMC were presented.

The 160th and last North Georgia Annual Conference concluded with a wonderful presentation by the Korean Church of Atlanta orchestra, a moving message by Rev. Max Vincent, Communion Service of Word and Table and the announcement of the New Appointments list. Duluth First UMC is keeping all our current clergy staff.

Next year's 2027 Georgia Annual Conference will be held in Athens at the Classic center on June 16 – 18, 2027.
