




## Library Book Club to Discuss






### Wednesday Night Food Drives in January



## New Titles in Our Church Library for Winter Reading

Cozy up with a good book this winter from **The Louise McDaniel Memorial Church Library**, located on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Sheldon Family Life Center, where you can find your next great read!

**The Life We Bury** by Allen Eskens (adult fiction). A college student interviews a dying Vietnam veteran and convicted murderer for a writing assignment, leading him on a quest to uncover the truth about the crime and confront his own personal demons.

**Mixed Blessings** by Barbara Brown Taylor (inspirational). In this new edition of her earliest collection of sermons, Barbara Brown Taylor brings her down-to-earth wisdom and keen perspective to the Bible readings of the lectionary cycle. Originally preached for the congregation of All Saints' Episcopal Church in downtown Atlanta, the topics of these sermons range from conversations with Abraham and Moses in the texts of the Hebrew scriptures to our awareness of the communion of saints and how to recognize a miracle when one comes our way.

**For Those Who Are Lost** by Julia Bryan Thomas (adult historical fiction). Inspired by true events, **For Those Who Are Lost** begins on the eve of the Nazi invasion of the island of Guernsey, when terrified parents have a choice to make: send their children alone to England, or keep the family together and risk whatever may come to their villages.

*Small Group Survey Results*


## Set Up Recurring Online Giving to the Church
