


#### Youth Ministry Sunday Night Gatherings for September

#### Seeking Volunteers for Altar Guild, Sacristans (Communion Servers), and Liturgists at the 8:30 Service



## Forum Class Volunteers at the North GA UMC Mission Hub

On August 9<sup>th</sup>, members of the **Forum Sunday School Class** came together to volunteer at the Mission Hub at the campus of The North Georgia Conference of The United Methodist Church, located at 1795 Old Peachtree Road NW (the former location of Sugarloaf United Methodist Church) in Duluth. Class members **verified and packed 300 hygiene kits** for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), which meant **6 boxes of hygiene kits** are ready to ship when needed.

#### **Operation Christmas Child**

We are gearing up for this year's **Operation Christmas Child**, our annual participation in **Samaritans Purse's** mission for God's children around the world. For 2024,

Samaritans Purse delivered over 11.9 million shoeboxes in over 170 countries and territories. Since the inception of the program in 1993, over 232 million shoeboxes have been delivered to children around the world.



By filling shoeboxes with toys, school supplies and hygiene items, you not only give to children in need the only gift they will likely receive for Christmas, but also help deliver hope, joy and the gospel of Jesus Christ to them and their families.

Many children who receive these shoeboxes gifts will also enroll in **Operation Christmas Child's** 12-lesson discipleship program, **The Greatest Journey**. In 2024, **over 5.5 million children** participated. This program teaches children about God's amazing love and guides them through what it means to faithfully follow Jesus Christ.

Empty shoe boxes will be available beginning Sunday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, in the Veterans Memorial Gathering Room, in the hallway by Hinton Hall, and outside of room F145, located on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the Sheldon Family Life Center. Inside each box you will find ideas on how to pack a shoebox gift, what not to include, and the adhesive box label.

There is a \$10 per shoebox processing donation for the empty shoeboxes you take and fill yourself. This not only covers the processing of the shoebox and shipping, but also supports the in-country ministry training and materials for *The Greatest Journey* activities. Using the adhesive labels allow you to register your shoebox(s), make your donation, and track your shoebox online. See additional information included in the empty shoebox.

Duluth First UMC will have a special web site for you to use if you choose to complete your shoebox online. This year we have increased the goal to **80 online shoeboxes** and expanded the timeframe. Additional information about the web page and specific instructions available for use of the online process will be available at the shoebox distribution locations throughout the church.

Please return your completed boxes to the Veterans Memorial Gathering Room, the Dorothy L. Rainey Fellowship Hall stage, in Hinton Hall, or outside room F145, located on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the Sheldon Family Life Center, **no later than Sunday, November 16**<sup>th</sup>.

This is such a worthwhile and fun project for our Sunday School classes, Women's Circles, our Youth Group, and families with their children to undertake. Let's try to better Duluth First UMC's total of **160 boxes** we packed last year!

## Online Option for Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes

The time has come for this year's **Operation Christmas Child**, our annual participation in **Samaritans Purse's** mission for God's children around the world. As we did

last year, there will be physical shoeboxes available to be completed by you, as well as the option to complete shoeboxes online.



If you wish to do your shoebox(s) online, please cuse the **DFUMC GOAL PAGE**,

a special personalized website available for use to complete your online shoebox. The **DFUMC GOAL PAGE** is now active, and the cost of the Build Online Shoebox option is \$30 per online shoebox. These online shoeboxes are delivered to certain locations that need special customs and cultural needs met. With the **DFUMC GOAL PAGE** there are two options this year: build the shoebox yourself by selecting items to be included in the shoebox, or you can select an option where the shoebox is built by **Samaritan's Purse**. This option is a "one and done" approach. You can also include the "*Greatest Journey*" materials to go along with your online shoebox for and additional \$6. Please consider this option.

This year we have increased our goal of online shoeboxes completed through the DFUMC GOAL PAGE to 80 shoeboxes, and we have extended the timeframe until Friday, December 19<sup>th</sup>. Specific instruction sheets have been prepared for using the DFUMC GOAL PAGE online process and are available at the Operation Christmas Child distribution locations around the church. By using the online DFUMC GOAL PAGE you will help make sure that every online shoebox from our church is counted toward our goal!

## Operation Christmas Child Kick-Off and Shoebox Packing Party a Major Success!








- Check in-person.
- Cash in-person.

- · Check or cash sent through the mail.
- Using the bill pay service through your bank (this ends up being a paper check that is sent through the mail).

While the church welcomes any gift, we have found the most safe and efficient ways to give are in-person or online through the church website and we recommend recurring giving. We would recommend NOT sending gifts through the mail at this time as we have had a few issues receiving gifts through the mail. Additionally, if you are using your bank's bill pay service to send your gifts, they are likely sending your gift by check through the mail.
