Grow One Step Chart

Many folks have found the **Grow One Step** chart helpful for their giving. Most of us know it's best for us to put God first and to move toward tithing (giving God the first 10% of our income). But we find it hard to get started. That's where the chart comes in.

Over a decade ago, a young couple I know with two school-aged daughters wanted to tithe. They were giving, but they didn't know what percentage of their income they were giving.

The grid side of the enclosed chart showed them that they were giving 2%. They decided to grow one step by giving 3% the next year. That worked, and they kept going – the following year – 4%, then 5%, etc. After eight years they were tithing, giving God 10%. They are happy to be continuing that practice today as their daughters graduate from college.


days, our kids are growing in faith and friendships every week.

We are looking forward to a meaningful and fun Fall Retreat together! Please keep our students, adult volunteers, and the retreat in your prayers!




Youth Ministry Sunday Night Gatherings for October

- Slim Jims, beef jerky.


Other Items:






Excellent Titles in Our Church Library for Fall Reading



 (Nonfiction). Written in the style of newspaper articles, these succinct applications to relevant issues of our time stimulate the reader to think about his own choices in facing the challenges of today.

 designers, and good neighbors.










Book Club to Discuss "Orphan Train" by Christina Baker Kline: Monday, October 20th




Book Club to Discuss "A Forever Christmas" by Missy Tippens: Monday, November 17th
