Celebrating the Season of Advent at Duluth First UMC

The season of Advent, which comes from the Latin word *adventus* meaning "coming" or "visit," begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. Advent is the beginning of the church year for Christians.

During Advent, we prepare for and anticipate the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for and need of

forgiveness, salvation and a new beginning. Even as we look back and celebrate the birth of Jesus in a humble stable in Bethlehem, we also look forward anticipating the second coming of Christ as the fulfillment of all that was promised by his first coming.

Advent begins with the fourth Sunday before

Christmas Day. This year Advent began on Sunday, November 30th, and ends at sundown on Wednesday, December 24th.

Although we are accustomed to celebrating Christmas on a single day, in both Christian tradition and on the church calendar, the Christmas season lasts from sundown on Christmas Eve (December 24th) through Epiphany of the Lord (January 4th). This is sometimes referred to as "the 12 days of Christmas."

The color for Advent has traditionally been purple, although some churches have adopted blue. In practice, however, as churches increasingly incorporate the symbols and decorations of Christmas during Advent, more and more red, green and gold are appearing. The United Methodist Book of Worship upholds the traditional color of purple for Advent, signifying penitence and royalty, but also allows blue, the color of hope.



This Advent, we invite you to join with us at Duluth First UMC as we prepare for and anticipate the coming of Christ. We are offering many opportunities for all ages to participate in this season. Explore the Advent opportunities detailed in this edition of The Messenger newsletter, helping to

make the Advent and Christmas seasons more meaningful for you, your family and friends.





The poinsettias will be used to adorn the Sanctuary and Hinton Hall on Sunday, December 21st, and on Christmas Eve. The cost per plant is \$20. You may pick up your poinsettia/poinsettias following the worship services on Christmas Eve. Printed copies of the poinsettia Remembrance/Honor listings will be available at the worship services on Sunday, December 21st, and at the three worship services on Christmas Eve.

All proceeds go to Seeds of Hope, whose funds are used to help meet the needs of God's people living in Duluth and Suwanee--often strangers, widows, orphans, homeless, those who are lost, and those who are without hope--who come to Duluth First United Methodist Church seeking assistance. In 2025 the number of assistance requests has been much higher than in the past. If you would like to contribute extra above/beyond the cost of your poinsettia(s), we thank you for your additional support of Seeds of Hope.

The End of the Year is Upon Us. Make an Impact with Your Year-End Giving!

As we move into the Christmas season, we are reminded that another year is coming to a close. The Finance Office of the church is ready to assist you with your year-end giving! There's still time to make a gift of stock—you may contact Benjamin Rah via e-mail at **brah@duluthumc.org** or call the church at 770-476-3776, ext. 120. All stock transactions must be completed no later than Wednesday, December 31, 2025, in order to receive tax credit.

If you're over 72 years old, year-end giving is a great opportunity to have your Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA contributed directly to the church also. It's a win-win. When you contribute your RMD that way, you save money by paying no taxes on it, and the church gets the full use of your gift because the church pays no tax on it, either.

As stipulated by IRS regulations, the church will be able to give year 2025 contribution credit (for tax purposes) for all donations received or post marked by December 31, 2025. The church office will be closed from Wednesday, December 24th, through Wednesday, December 31st.

We will also receive donations on Sundays, December 21st and 28th, at all of our morning worship services (8:30 Traditional, 11:00 Contemporary, 11:00 Traditional), as well on Wednesday, December 24th, at our Christmas Eve services (noon, 4:00 and 6:00 p.m.) You may also mail your donations. In addition, we accept credit/debit card contributions online! Just go to the church's website at duluthumc.org and click on the ONLINE GIVING tab.







Double red cell donations collect twice the amount of red blood cells in a single visit. During this process, a special machine separates the red blood cells from your blood and returns the plasma and platelets to you. This allows you to donate every 112 days, and the donated red cells are crucial for patients with sickle cell anemia, blood loss, or who need trauma transfusions.

A big "Thank You" to those came to give but were unable to donate blood, and to the wonderful blood drive volunteers, Pat Brannon and Angie Doerlich.

The next blood drive at Duluth First UMC will be held on February 4, 2026, from 3 to 7p.m. in the Dorothy L. Rainey Fellowship Hall. Giving blood is a simple yet impactful way to make a difference. One donation can save up to three lives. Imagine the joy knowing that you saved up to 3 lives!



In this new edition of her earliest collection of sermons, Barbara Brown Taylor brings her down-to-earth wisdom and keen perspective to the Bible readings of the lectionary cycle. Originally preached for the congregation of All Saints' Episcopal Church in downtown Atlanta, the topics of these sermons range from conversations with Abraham and Moses in the texts of the Hebrew scriptures to our awareness of the communion of saints and how to recognize a miracle when one comes our way.
