Along with the gathering of family and friends around a bountiful table of food and conversation, many take this opportunity to remember their blessings. This short Thanksgiving devotional with Bible verses and tips for giving thanks this day and the year through is a good place to start.

Thanksgiving in God's Presence

Thanksgiving is an invitation into God's presence. On Thanksgiving Day, we are reminded of God's presence through prayer and by recounting our blessings. My husband is usually the designated person to pray a hearty prayer before our meal. But the beautiful thing is that God invites us into His presence with thanksgiving all year long. Psalm 95:2 says "Come into His presence with thanksgiving." The Psalmist knew the importance of thanksgiving when entering the temple for worship. In Philippians 4:6, Paul encourages us "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." In this verse, thanksgiving is not just the attitude we are supposed to have when we ask God for our needs, but it is the answer to anxiety in every situation. Giving thanks in God's presence is a daily thing.

We can do this in a number of ways:

- Start each prayer with thanking God for what He has already done for us before we ask for what we need.
- Write down our thanks to God to keep us in the habit of it. I have some friends who have a thankfulness journal and they write down one thing they are thankful for every day.
- Pray a prayer of thanksgiving before you eat every meal. Many of us grew up with this habit, but if you have fallen out of the habit, restart today.

May this Thanksgiving Day remind you to bring thanksgiving into God's presence all year long.

Serving with the Joy of Jesus

As Christian servants, volunteers know what it means to serve with the joy of Jesus. They don't rush through their tasks. Instead, they take time to show Jesus' loving care to those they serve. They aren't simply checking to-dos off a list. They are taking in God's wisdom and guidance, and then considering where their service is needed most. They aren't responding to a pastor nagging at them. They are serving out of a loving, grace-filled heart. And we are forever grateful for their joyful service in Jesus' name! We echo the words of Paul from 1 Thessalonians 1:2 -3 We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers; remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labor of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God and our Father. (All of us, as believers, are called to serve with the joy of Jesus—because Jesus served us with joy. His joy was present from the very moment he entered our world. While it's nearly incomprehensible to us, Jesus joyfully died on the cross. To serve us, sinners who deserve nothing but pain and death, Jesus joyfully offered himself up to be our sacrifice. He took all of our sins, all of our guilt, and all of our shame. He didn't do it because it was on his list of things to do or because the Father was nagging him. He went to the cross because he loves us! Hebrews 12:2 tells us that he joyfully suffered for our sins and rose again on the third day because it was all part of the Father's will—our God, who wouldn't leave his children without a Savior. Jesus' joy was on full display on Calvary's cross, a joy that came from the pure love, grace, and mercy of our heavenly Father.

Because Jesus served us with joy, we now serve him with joy. We don't need to worry about the obligation of Christian service, like we are building some sort of resume for heaven. We don't need to carry ministry like it's a burden, part of the Christian life that bogs us down. We don't need to worry that God's promises are too good to be true, approaching the gates of heaven with the worry that Jesus will say, "Oops, you didn't do enough. "No—we serve with the joy of Jesus! Throughout all of our days, God enables our joy and our service. We walk in his ways, remembering the call of the psalmist: Serve the LORD with gladness (Psalm 100:2 KJV)

Thank you again for all your countless hour of serving the Lord!




Daylight Savings Time Ends
