

The seminar is of significance to all age groups and will have special interest to young couples, parents of young families, as well as those reaching middle age and planning for retirement.



INDIGENOUS RESOURCES CIRCLE

May 5, 2024 - Red Dress Day

You may have noticed in recent years red dresses or skirts hanging in trees, or on a house porch. These symbols are intentionally displayed to increase awareness of the dangers and harms that are done, particularly against Indigenous women and girls in Canada. According to a 2014 report by the RCMP, Indigenous women are 4x more likely to be murdered than non-Indigenous



women in Canada. These women and girls are disproportionately impacted by violence, including physical and sexual assault, homicide and human trafficking.

Honouring Red Dress Day (May 5, 2024) is one way we can acknowledge these issues. But as is often pointed out, awareness and signals are not enough. We need to address the root causes of why these harms continue to happen. We want to do what we can to support Indigenous communities in their efforts to heal, grow and thrive.

What can we do to ensure there is access to clean water, adequate housing and healthcare in Indigenous communities? How can we support Indigenous-led efforts to address violence, such as the National Inquiry Into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls?

Sadly, not everyone has a place of safety and belonging. May Red Dress Day prompt us to pray for all those impacted by such harsh treatments, and may we be willing to be used by God to bring peace, healing, and acceptance to our communities.








June is National Indigenous

Stephanie showcased Malawi's culture with art, carvings, and Malawian cuisine. Stephanie highlighted NCM Malawi's community partnerships aimed at self-sufficiency, such as sustainable water projects and educational initiatives.

Sam spoke clearly that the call of short-term missions isn't project-centred, but to "join in His Work and enter the community to learn and offer encouragement". Sam saw how the church worked with the community to provide for physical needs to "demonstrate God's love to the community".

One takeaway from this tour is the necessity to go into communities with the mindset to learn from those they visited. All participants were inspired by the vitality of the Malawian Church, which could serve as a model for us.
