3. Doctrine of God, Part 1

It is a basic biblical truth that God's self-revelation is itself a call to active

Romans 1:18-21 "18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. 19 For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. 20 For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse. 21 For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened."

<u>Gen 17:1-2</u> "1 When Abram was ninety-nine years old the Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless, 2 that I may make my covenant between me and you, and may multiply you greatly.""

<u>Rev 4:11</u> "11 "Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created.""

3.1 Dual Doctrines: The Incomprehensibility and Knowability of God

Definition: Because of his self-revelation, God can be known, but never ______ understood, by his human creatures.

1. We are dependent upon Him for ______ *knowledge* of Him – non-saving knowledge: (Rom 1:19 ESV) For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.

2. We are dependent upon Him for <u>knowledge</u> of Him. (<u>Mat 11:27</u> ESV) ... no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

3. God has not revealed ______. Deut 29:29 "The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things that are revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may do all the words of this law."
