A short & simple personal/family devotional resource for use during the season of Advent

Day #20 (Begin with prayer.)

All: O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, this is the day that You have made; let us rejoice and be glad in it! Thank You for bringing us together in worship today. Please bless our time with You and one another, and help us grow in Christian faith, community, and mission: All in the name of Jesus! Amen.

Leader: Jesus Christ is the Light of the world,

All: the light no darkness can overcome. (John 1)

Leader: Jesus, let Your light scatter the darkness

All: and shine in our hearts today! (2 Corinthians 4)

(Give light to the first three candles on the Advent wreath.)



Leader: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Leader: This is the day the Lord has made;

All: let us rejoice and be glad in it! (Psalm 118)

Leader: From the rising of the sun to the place where it sets,

All: the name of the Lord is to be praised. (Psalm 113)

Leader: Jesus said, "You are the light of the world.

All: A city on a hill cannot be hidden.

Leader: People don't light a lamp and then hide it;

All: they put it on its stand and it gives light to all.

Leader: In the same way,

All: let your light shine before others,

Leader: that they may see your good deeds

All: and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5)

Go tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere;





From the Bible, read **Matthew 2:3-6**. If in a family, try reading verse by verse.

Think/Talk About It

1. Have you ever been disturbed? What happened and why did it disturb you?
2. When King Herod met the Magi and heard they were looking for the new king, he was disturbed (v.3). Why? Notice also– did King Herod even know where the Messiah was supposed to be born? What does that tell you about him?
3. When we do not know the answer to one of life's biggest questions, where should we look (see v.5 for a clue)? How has God's Word helped you learn His answers to some of your biggest questions? Can you give at least one example?

Take time to pray to the One who loves to hear you! Remember the 2 Best Prayers We Know: "Thank You..." and "Please help..." Start with those and fill in the rest from there. Then continue by praying:

All: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
