Strengthening Christ in us has been our focus for Lent this year as we have looked at hope both in worship and in our book study. I will be honest, some of the ideas about





Community Forum

We are preparing to restart the Community Forums. Initially, we plan on doing them about once a quarter. We are making arrangements with the Justice League of Greater Lansing for a program on racism and the mission of the Justice League. Holy Week

Sunday, April 2, 2023 at 10:00 we will begin Holy Week with a celebration of Palm/Passion Sunday. We will remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem as the faithful gathered to celebrate the Passover. Passover was a time when the Romans increased their military presence to keep the people in line.

Thursday, April 6, 2023 at 7:00 we will celebrate Maundy Thursday with Communion and a Tenebrae Service. This is the night when Jesus gathered with his disciples in the Upper Room to share a final meal before his arrest. It was the night he gave us



the gift of communion, which we will share together. It is also the night of his arrest, and we will remember the gathering darkness as we share the story and dim the lights as we hear again the story of Christ's suffering and death.

Sunday, April 9, at 10:00 we will celebrate Christ's Resurrection. We will have a continental breakfast upstairs beginning at 9:15, with left-overs following the service. The choir will sing as we celebrate Christ's victory over death and the hope that gives us.



One Great Hour of Sharing

One of the special offerings we receive each year in support of the larger ministry of our denomination is One Great Hour of Sharing. This offering supports 3 programs of the denomination: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP), and Self-Development of People (SDOP). All of these ministries are focused on equipping individuals and communities to address local problems.

The Presbyterian Hunger Program is at work around the world. It focuses on providing the knowledge and tools to support families and communities by providing clean wells, farm animals, equipment, and most importantly, education. Through One Great Hour of Sharing, we equip people to address the challenge of hunger in their own communities.
