Holy Week is a busy time. Life is easier when I plan worship themes ahead of time. I need to be far enough ahead on the work to handle a funeral.

There has been one thing I've known through the changes and challenges of ministry: God has always been with me. That's one thing that will not change with retirement. God isn't retiring. We are all living with uncertainty about the future and what it will look like. There is one thing that is still certain: God will be with us. God will guide us and give us the resources to live out God's call to us. God's presence is the stability, and the certainty, that carries us through the changes and uncertainties of life.

Strategic Planning Update

The Strategic Planning Team had their second meeting with the Project Regeneration Team from the Presbyterian Foundation on October 25. We reviewed the 2022 Church Giving Analysis for Delta Presbyterian and the Church Assessment and Recommendation reports prepared by the Project Regeneration Team. We are still digesting the information received in the survey and will provide an update on the results at a later date.

We discussed our thoughts and reflections on the ideas for moving the church forward presented in the book <u>Sailboat Church</u>. The discussion was followed by instructions for the "forty days of prayer and discernment" for the Holy Spirit to guide the Strategic Planning Team and the congregation in planning the future of Delta and what our ministry should look like. We are now in the midst of 40 days of prayer. During this time we are not meeting or discussing the possibilities. We are individually prayerfully considering seven high-level options for Delta's future direction. We will meet again in December to process what we have heard as we have prayed and listened to God.

The Strategic Planning Team requests you join us in prayer as we progress in seeking the future of the ministry at Delta. If the Spirit speaks to you, please pass the message along.
