I am very excited for Delta, and encourage you to read the information from the Strategic Planning Team to learn more about plans for the future. Sue Settle has written an article that describes their process and how they lived into our vision.

<u>Maundy Thursday</u>

We will celebrate Maundy Thursday at 7:00 pm on March 28. We have invited Dimondale to join us.

On the first Maundy Thursday, the night Jesus was to be arrested, he gathered with his disciples in an upper room to celebrate the Passover. Every year religious people celebrated the Passover, which reminded them of God delivering them from slavery in Egypt and leading them to the Promised Land. This meal, called the Seder, included specific foods that served as reminders of what God had done in the past. They dipped parsley or celery in salt water to remind them of God's promise of new life in the Promised Land and the tears they cried during slavery. They ate unleavened bread to remind them that their ancestors had fled in such haste that they didn't take time to allow the bread to rise before baking it. Jesus gathered with the disciples that night to remember God's deliverance from slavery in Egypt into the Promised Land,

Jesus added to the meal and transformed it into what we remember on Maundy Thursday. He lifted the bread as a reminder of his body, which he would give for us on the cross the next day. He shared the cup as a reminder of the new covenant that would be made through the spilling of his blood during the crucifixion.

When we gather on Maundy Thursday this year, we will remember. We will remember God's deliverance from slavery in Egypt and from sin and death. Join us as we share in the Lord's Supper and remember.

<u>Good Friday</u>

We have been invited to share in Good Friday worship at First Presbyterian Church of Dimondale* at 7:00 pm on March 29. On Good Friday, we remember Jesus' suffering and death on the cross. We are reminded of his suffering and death as we await the Good News of Easter morning.

Strategic Planning Team: Following God into the Future

"Rejoice in the Lord always, again I will say, rejoice." (Philippians 4:4)

The Strategic Planning Team truly rejoices in the Lord!! We have been on a challenging "journey" as we anticipated and prepared for our pastor's retirement. This journey has been unlike the typical travel-type journey as we entered this journey without a roadmap – no GPS or even a foldable paper map! Amazingly though, as the team reflected on the process near the conclusion of the journey, we realized that we did, in fact, have a road map all along and that our guide was God. The roadmap? Delta's Guiding Principles! These principles were developed jointly by the Session and Deacons as they discerned what should guide our congregation at Delta. These principles are noted each month on the Session's meeting agenda as a reminder that God is always present.

Here are the guiding principles and the impact they had on the Strategic Planning Team. God continues to be our guide!

- A. God is for us The Strategic Planning Team believed all through the process of discerning Delta's future that God is for us and with us, and with our faith in God, he would be our "guide" throughout the journey.
- B. God is at work in us, through us, and around us Each member of the Strategic Planning Team brought their own personal perspective to the journey. Also, we realized that we were just a part of the plan and needed to work through this journey while establishing communication with the congregation. We needed to be open and transparent with the congregation and we did that. This occurred through the team's dedication and communication with the congregation via a congregational survey, discussions, and presentations. And we did it even though we could share only as much as we knew, even though many times we had to say "We don't know yet". God was working through us and it continued to be important to have communication with opportunities for feedback.
- C. Watch, learn, and participate in what God is doing The Strategic Planning Team watched for and searched for ways to continue on the journey. This led to learning about the Presbyterian Foundation Project Regeneration and enlisting their support in discernment for the future. The team read the book <u>The Sailboat Church</u> which included a 40 days of prayer commitment by each member of the team. During the 40 days we were to continue our reading, pray, and listen for guidance (remember God is our guide!). At the end of the 40 days we once again met with the facilitator from Project Regeneration to discuss and discern what we learned and had occurred to us during that time. It became apparent that now the path on our journey was becoming clearer and more concrete.
- D. Be not afraid As the pathway became more pronounced there was some concern as the team was contemplating something that in the past would most likely not have been considered. We needed to be open to doing something that none of us had ever experienced and was outside of our mental model of what a church could look like. The scary word "change" was now a critical part of the conversation and we realized that if this was to work there needed to be a strong and broad consensus within the congregation. We continued to have a strong belief and faith that God was still guiding us and the path held promise.
- E. **Turn your worries and hopes into prayers-** Now, with a sense of where God was guiding us and what the path could look like and with the realization that changes would indeed need to occur there were worries. But there was also good news there was hope! So the worries and hopes were prayed over and the team continued to listen for guidance.
- F. God's got our backs The process that the Strategic Planning Team embarked on was a step in faith for all of us, and regardless of how much praying and planning we did, no one can know if it is actually going to work or not. The team spent numerous hours discerning separately and together, explored and sought new ways to listen to and answer God's call, and to follow the path as our journey continues. We are encouraged and delighted by the decision to become a "yoked" congregation with First Presbyterian Church, Dimondale, knowing that this a new "norm" and that the road map was aptly guided with faith in God's plan for Delta. Ultimately, God does have our backs and we are excited for what is to come. Rejoice!!

Summary of Strategic Planning Team Update

Summary of Strategic Planning Team Update to the Congregation at the March 24 Congregational Meeting

- The Strategic Planning Team (SPT) has been coordinating with Rev. Ben Rumbaugh and the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Dimondale over the past several months to explore the possibility of hiring Ben to be a full time pastor working half time for each of the two congregations (aka yoking).
- We are happy to report that we have arrived at a "Covenant for Cooperative Ministry" for the two churches sharing one full time pastor.
- At the March 24 meeting, we presented:
 - A brief recap of the activities since our last update in December
 - 1. March 18 Delta Session voted to present the following three motions to the congregation to be voted on at the April 14 Congregational Meeting:
 - a. Approval of the "Covenant for Cooperative Ministry" between Delta Presbyterian, Dimondale First Presbyterian and the Rev. Ben Rumbaugh
 - b. Call the Rev. Ben Rumbaugh as half time Designated Installed Pastor
 - c. Approve the terms of call for Ben
 - 2. March 21 Presbytery Committee on Ministry (COM) approved the three motions above.
 - 3. March 22 Dimondale Session voted to present the above three motions to their congregation for a vote at their March 24 Congregational Meeting.
 - 4. March 24 First Presbyterian Church of Dimondale approved the above three motions at their Congregational Meeting.

The "Covenant of Cooperative Ministry" and the Terms of Call are also located under the "SPT Cooperative Ministry" tab. Printed copies of both documents are also located on the Commitment Center.

 - b. Approve calling the Rev. Ben Rumbaugh as Delta's Part-time Designated Installed pastor for a two year contract.
 - c. Approve the terms of call for the Rev. Ben Rumbaugh
- Sunday, May 19 Wendy's last service and 3:00 PM retirement celebration with program and supper (sign-up sheet at the Commitment Center.)
- Sunday, May 26 Delta Worships at Dimondale 10:00 am service (Memorial Day weekend, no pulpit supply at Delta)
 - Monday, June 1 "Covenant for Cooperative Ministry" begins
- Sunday, June 2 Delta Worships at Dimondale 10:00 am service
- Sunday, June 9 Dimondale worships at Delta 10:00 am service
- Sunday, June 16 begin two services Delta service at 9:00 am and Dimondale at 11:00 am
