Daily Devotions & Scriptures

This week is Holy Week, a time for reflection and penitence as we walk with Christ through his last days, final supper, betrayal, arrest, torture and death. It is a time to remember that it is OUR sins, not just those of two millennia ago, that sent him to the cross. Take the time as you read this painfully familiar story to ponder your own failings and reflect thankfully on the grace of God for you. Only by this difficult path will the joy of Easter have true and personal meaning.

Monday, March 29 Read John 12:1-11

Judas is not wrong, really. The money could have been used for important and good things. If that's true, what is wrong with his attitude and priorities? What does this say about what you value, spend your energy and resources on and where your discipleship fits in that list?

Tuesday March 30 Read John 12:20-36

None of us much likes the idea of sacrificing. Given that, why is sacrifice such a central part of gracious love and discipleship? What sort of things or attitudes do we hold onto so fervently and at what ultimate cost?

Wednesday, March 31 Read John 13:21-32

It would appear that the disciples, even Judas himself, were unaware of the identity of the betrayer even with Jesus telling them. Could it be that Judas and the others were so convinced they were right they couldn't conceive of their actions as betrayal? In what ways do we seek our own ends at Christ's expense? How are do we use Jesus for our own profit and advantage?

Maundy Thursday, April 1 Read John 13:1-17;31-35 *Maundy Thursday Service 6:30pm*

It looks as though Peter was not so much appalled at the thought of washing feet as he was at the thought of having to have *his* feet washed. In what ways can you relate to that? What does his attitude say about our aversion to humility and being indebted to another's love and grace? Reflect on this and the nature of your own sin, saying a prayer to God for forgiveness.

Good Friday, April 2 Read John 18:1-19:42 *Good Friday Service 6:30pm*

As you read the story of Jesus' trial and execution, take it slowly and imagine yourself present on this horrific day. What part of the story moves you most? What part of this seems to speak directly to you? Say a prayer of thanks today.

Holy Saturday, April 3 Read 1 Peter 4:1-8

As we prepare for Easter, ponder the reality of this passage in pointing out that Christ's offering is meant to work a change in our lives, attitudes and goals. How does the Resurrection shape the way you set goals, treat others, spend resources and set priorities?
