Daily Devotions & Scriptures

Monday, April 4 Read Psalm 126

How does your life exhibit the joy of knowing God's victory and His presence in your life? List some specific examples. If your life doesn't seem to be a testimony to God's power and presence, why not? Where have you seen the Lord at work in your life in the last few days?

Tuesday April 5 Read Isaiah 43

Sometimes, because we've been through many Easters, we forget that in redeeming us from our sinful ways, God is indeed doing a new thing (v.19) in our lives. How does the reality of Christ's loving sacrifice for you personally, shape the way you view your life and purpose? Talk it over with God in prayer today.

Wednesday, April 6 Read Philippians 3:4b-14

Look closely at v.8. Paul was, by the standards of those around him, a good and successful man. Yet he knew that those standards were flawed from God's eternal perspective. Prayerfully discuss with God this question: Is your life a success? By what standards? Where might God be calling you to be more than you think you can be?

Thursday, April 7 Read John 12:1-8

Apart from John's commentary on Judas' thievery, why was his criticism so wrong? What did Jesus mean by "you will always have the poor but you won't always have me?" What does this say about our ministry priorities? Is worship more important than doing good works? Why or why not?

Friday, April 8 Read Romans 8:6-11

After reading this passage, reflect back on the reading from yesterday. How might Judas' mind have been 'set on the flesh' and how was Mary's 'set on the Spirit?' What are some ways in our lives that we set our minds (and bodies and goals) on things of earth (flesh) and what might being focused on the Spirit really look like?

Saturday, April 9 Read Psalm 130

Reflect on the meaning of vv.3-4. What does this psalm say to your life particularly? Why? What does it mean for *you* to wait upon the Lord today?
