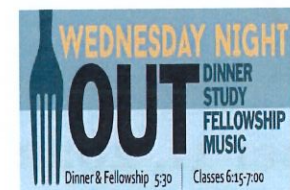

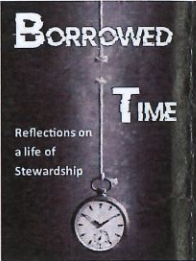


UMM will meet on Monday night at 6:30 pm in the Rose Room. Cliff Harpe will be the speaker on “Inneagram”.

Daily Devotions & Scriptures

Monday, September 12 Read Acts 2:1-21

Recently, we celebrated Pentecost, the in-breaking of God’s Spirit to change the world and launch the church into its mission. One aspect of the story is the patience of the disciples, waiting as commanded and intently listening and watching for God to work. How does our modern busy-ness often inhibit our ability to pay attention to God? Where are some areas in which you need to “clear the air?”

Tuesday, September 13 Read Psalm 104:24-35

So many things in our lives demand the best of our time and energies, but here the psalmist reminds us that God alone is the source of life and all good things. Do you personally believe that? Do the ways you spend your time and resources reflect that belief? Why or why not? Discuss this with God in prayer today.

Wednesday, September 14 Read Deuteronomy 5:12 & Isaiah 58:13-14

The command to take Sabbath comes fourth in the list of commandments (Exodus 20:1-17) immediately after serving only one God, not making idols and not using the Lord for our own purposes. Given that and what is said in the Isaiah passage here, why is Sabbath so important? How do you honor Sabbath and what tends to try and fill your time and clutter your life instead?

Thursday, September 15 Read Exodus 16:13-30

Sabbath is also about learning to rely on God (as in the story of the manna) instead of ourselves or anything else the world says is important. How does our non-stop flow of technology, information and entertainment call us away from dependence upon God? How hard would it be for you to, say, do without computers, cell phones and TV for two or three days? Why might it be difficult and what does this tell you about your own dependencies?

Friday, September 16 Read Mark 2:23-28

As Jesus tries to explain here, keeping Sabbath is not about rules and God being picky but rather it is about the need to de-clutter and de-compress and a gift from God for a more healthy and full life. Reflect on Sabbath keeping as gift. How are you taking advantage of this gift?

Saturday, September 17 Read Matthew 11:28-30

Why do so many seem to find following Christ to be a burden while at the same time they allow themselves to be burdened by the never-ending and unreasonable demands of earthly and social desires? What are some of the things that keep us in the “rat race” and in what ways is Jesus’ yoke lighter. Be as specific as possible.
