Thursday, December 5 Read Romans 13:11-14

When we flip the light on in a dark room it's amazing how dark and scary spaces become warm and welcoming. Seeing the truth helps us put things into perspective and here Paul reminds us that Jesus' arrival is like flipping on
that switch. Of course, such revelation may show things we don't want seen but the Light is coming so it's best to be ready! How do you want Christ to see you as the Advent season gets underway?
Discuss this with Him in prayer today.
Friday, December 6 Read Matthew24:36-44
Being ready to receive Christ isn't like cramming for a test. We can't do it at short notice (or, as here, <i>no</i> notice!) but we must have lives permanently shaped to fit Him; permanently prepared with room for Jesus to dwell. What steps do you need to take to reshape your life in order to be compatible and connected with Emmanuel, "God with us?"
Saturday, December 7 Read Psalm 25:1-10
This psalm is one of the most profound statements of faith. Read it through a few times as your own personal prayer. In what ways can you "lift your soul" to God and how can you nurture that sort of faith?
