Daily Devotions & Scriptures

Monday, October 27 Read Psalm 27

This is such a song of confidence, faith and hope. Read it through a few times just reflecting on the imagery and on the inspiration for David's confidence. Then reflect on v.4. Why is this what David asks for? If you set aside the vision of the church building or even of the Jerusalem Temple (neither of which existed when this Psalm was written!), what exactly is the psalmist desiring here? How can this be your prayer as well?

Tuesday October 28 Read Proverbs 3:5-10

The proverbs sums up the ultimate source of friction between God and humanity as well as the prescription for all of the suffering that we create. Meditate a bit on vv.9-10. How is this a concrete expression of trust and worship? What doubts or lack of faith keeps us from following the guidance offered here? Why?

Wednesday, October 29 Read Deuteronomy 6:1-19

The Shema (v.4; lit. "Listen!") is the central prayer in Judaism and commands disciples to full commitment to God. This is not a passive belief but an active commitment that should permeate one's entire life, hence the instructions to teach and daily observe consistent practices. Why is humility so important to fulfilling this prayer (see vv.10-12)? What are the 'doorposts' on which our discipleship is prominently displayed?

Thursday, October 30 Read Matthew 22:34-40

Jesus reaffirms the *shema* of Deuteronomy as central to Christian faith as well. Indeed, v.40 reminds us that it is the core of every law, practice and Christian aspiration! Why is this so vital to everything we understand our faith to be? In our worst moments, what takes the place of God in our hearts, minds and energies? Where is God displaced in your life? Discuss this with God in prayer today?

Friday, October 31 Read Colossians 3:1-17

What does putting God first look like according to this passage? Note that here prioritizing God is defined as living a new, resurrected life while putting to death all the old priorities. What priorities need to die in your life and why? How can God work with you to do that?

Saturday, November 1 Read Matthew 6:19-21 & 31-33

The phrase "storing up" reminds us that it takes effort to choose something other than God; it's not an accident! How does what we treasure shape our priorities? What do your efforts, energies and goals say about what is truly important to you? What would it look like for you to "seek first the Kingdom of God" in practical, daily terms?
