Daily Devotions & Scriptures

Monday, September 22 Read Psalm 113

Read this through again as your own personal prayer. What does this psalm tell you about the nature of God? What does it tell you about the relationship with God between humanity in general, and you in particular?

Tuesday September 23 Read Jeremiah 8:18-9:1

The wording of this passage can be difficult so try reading it in something like the CEV or even a paraphrase like "The Message." In all translations this is a cry of despair from a people suffering for the consequences of their faithless actions. Why do we so often ignore God until we are broken and suffering? What lesson were the Israelites (and us) supposed to learn from this turn of events? Why?

Wednesday, September 24 Read Amos 8:4-7

To connect with and treat others well is not simply a good option, it is mandated by God and furthering our own positions at the expense of others is an outrage to the Lord. What excuses do we use to mistreat or demean others? How can we, as representatives of Christ, be ambassadors for justice and graciousness?

Thursday, September 25 Read 1 Timothy 2:1-7

The scripture is very clear as to what God's purpose is (v.4) and what defines and drives that purpose (vv.5-6). Of course, the world always pushed back, resisting God and substituting its own "truths." How and why, then, is prayer (vv.1-3) the first line of our response to opposition and challenge? What does this say about the nature of faith and discipleship?

Friday, September 26 Read Luke 16:1-13

This is a difficult parable with many different levels of meaning. At its heart though is the reminder that the things that seem to matter so much in this world (wealth, status, security) hold little currency in God's Kingdom. Re-read vv.12-13 and reflect on what it means to understand yourself as a steward of God's resources. What things other than God- are we tempted to serve?

Saturday, September 27 Read Psalm 79:1-9

In this lament for Jerusalem we are reminded that there are consequences for ignoring or diminishing God's commands for our lives. In light of the readings this week, how "immovable" is God in your life and how much do you expect God to adjust to your personal goals, concerns or excuses? Discuss the nature of your relationship with God in prayer today.
