Daily Devotions & Scriptures

Monday, September 7 Read Psalm 25

The psalmist pleads for God’s grace all the while remembering how undeserving he is of it (see vv.7, 9 & 11). Think of someone with whom you have or have had a conflict or possibly harbor hard feelings. How would praying this psalm help your attitude? Why?

Tuesday September 8 Read Zechariah 7:1-14

God’s fearful judgment here is a product of the attitude of the Israelites. Their actions- even in worship- were not humble or altruistic but rather self-serving and divisive. Look at vv.8-10. What does God desire from his people? In what ways are we tempted to manipulate our discipleship and worship to serve our own ends?

Wednesday, September 9 Read Matthew 23:1-15

Look closely at v.3 here and note that the sin of the Pharisees is not in failing to keep the Law but in their attitudes in so doing. Even while closely following the proper behavior, what are they doing wrong? In what ways are we sometimes motivated by the same things that drive these folks in vv. 5-7? How does this keep us from being gracious and forgiving?

Thursday, September 10 Read Galatians 5:13-26

Take a moment and prayerfully reflect on what the Scripture might be saying to us in our dealing with folks who have clearly sinned or might have even wronged us personally. Re-read and meditate on v. 13 in particular. How is this different from what the Pharisees (from yesterday’s reading) might have done? What does it mean in real practical terms to become enslaved to one another through love? How is this the very embodiment of Christ?

Friday, September 11 Read Romans 12:9-21

While the Bible does not dismiss sin as inconsequential, it also recognizes our own tendency to use another’s sinfulness as a means of elevating ourselves and asserting control. Re-read vv.17-21. Before we judge or condemn another, what must we strive for first? What must we be conscious of in ourselves and avoid? What should be our ultimate goal?

Saturday, September 12 Read Matthew 7:1-5 & Colossians 4:5-6

Read together, what are these two verses suggesting about the balance between calling out sin and practicing Christ-like graciousness? Ultimately, in being either judgmental or gracious what is our ultimate goal and what should be our goal?
