# Something Very Easy (and Very Hard) Pastor Jerry



There is nothing in the world that is easier to do than to pray. Even toddlers can do it. As soon as they grasp the concept of a God that they cannot see but who can hear them (a concept that they usually accept much more readily than adults do), they start chatting with God. Maybe you've heard a preschooler pray like this: they talk to God as if they were talking to a friend at preschool or to a patient grandmother or aunt – stream-of-consciousness one-sided conversations about what they like and don't like, what happened yesterday, and what they'd like to happen tomorrow.

Of course that doesn't last long. Perhaps they notice that grown-ups never seem to talk so casually to God, and they begin to get self-conscious or, worse, more conscious of who might be listening. They don't want to do it wrong, so they try to do it the way grown-ups do: seldom, briefly, usually just to ask for things, and often using a specialized prayer language. But there's the problem. That last part is hard. It takes a lot of work to learn that you're supposed to say, "Lord, today we ask you to . . ." instead of "God, will you . . . ?" the way you would talk to anyone else. You have to learn to ask for "your grace" or "your blessing" instead of saying "God, can you do me a favor?" You have to learn how to say "Forgive me" or "I ask your forgiveness" instead of "Sorry."

It's complicated, and as I say, learning how to speak Prayer takes practice – just like learning any new language. Many people never really get comfortable with it, even as adults. A lot of church members inhabit a strange middle ground, like someone who studied Spanish for several years in school. They can understand it all right when someone else speaks it, but they freeze up and get self-conscious when they have to speak it themselves. Fortunately, pastors and a few other church leaders are bilingual, so most people are happy to let those who are more fluent do the praying.

In the paragraph above, I was half-joking about how we've turned prayer into a specialized skill, but it's not funny. There is nothing more important to a growing Christian life than prayer. You could argue, in fact, that it's the *only* essential ingredient. This is why I keep harping on the subject. Since coming to Lake Street, I've done two different sermon series and I think three different Lenten series on prayer. And yes, this Lent we're going to do another one. It matters that much.

It would be great if we could all recover the un-self-consciousness of the preschooler chatting with God, but I don't see that happening. You can't turn the clock back on self-awareness. But there must be some way to recover the child's comfort with praying. And whatever we come up with should do the following things:

- It should get rid of the idea that there is a standard required prayer language.
- It should enable people to pray in a way that feels natural to them, so that prayer will not feel like a chore.

 Given that people are different and are not going to feel all natural doing the same thing the same way, it should acknowledge more than one style of prayer.

So that will be the focus of our Lenten study this year, beginning on February 21. Using the idea of "multiple learning intelligences," developed by educational theorist Howard Gardner, we will talk about finding a way to pray that suits the way you think and learn. On the first Wednesday evening we will take a pre-test designed to help us each identify our individual learning intelligences, and those results will determine what we do at the following sessions. At all the sessions, we plan to share a meal together in the Fellowship Hall.

So come out on Wednesday evenings during Lent, enjoy some time with your church family around the table, and maybe find a way to take some of the stress and pressure of prayer by learning how to do it less like a standard issue grown-up and more like . . . well, you. And if prayer feels like you, maybe then, once again, it will be easy.

### Worship in February

Ash Wednesday. Lent is early this year, beginning with Ash Wednesday, on February 14. This year we are trying something new: a joint Ash Wednesday service with Hope and Pleasant Valley United Methodist Churches. Actually two services. The first will be held at 1:00pm here at Lake Street, and the second will be held at 6:00pm at Hope. The idea is for members of all three churches who would prefer a daytime service to come to Lake Street and for those from all three churches who would rather have an evening service to gather at Hope, on Golf Road. The services will be basically the same, and Pastors Jen Barnet and Jerry Morris will lead both.

Lent Services/Studies/Meals. This year we will not be having special Lenten worship services. Instead, we are going to have Wednesday evening Lenten meals together in the Fellowship Hall at 5:00pm, which will include about half an hour of learning and talking together about different styles of prayer. (See the pastor's article on p.1 and the article "Prayer Intelligences" on p. 6.)

The meals will be simple and will almost certainly include ordering pizza at least once, but they will be meals, not just snacks. Choir members, come early and eat together before going to rehearsal.

Dear brothers, sisters and pastor, your **CONTRIBUTIONS AND YOUR OFFERINGS**, are very valuable and it is a great blessing for our New Canaan Methodist Church located in the city of El Alto La Paz – Bolivia, so once again we express our deep thanks and gratitude to your church and your families, giving thanks to God, for their lives, for their work and the mission they carry out.

## **Loose Change Mission Offering in February: Dignity Kits:**

For the past few years, our Mission Team has devoted our monthly mission offerings in February and March to Flood Buckets to give through the Conference to the Midwest Mission Distribution Center, for disaster relief. This year, following the lead of the Conference, we are doing something slightly different: Dignity Kits. These are selfcontained kits of personal toiletries. These also will be given through the conference to the Midwest Mission Center, but they are more flexible - still useful for people recovering from floods, but also useful for other natural disasters or simply for unhoused people. Each kit contains:

- 1 Hand towel
- 1 Washcloth
- 1 Adult toothbrush
- 1 Bar soap
- 1 Shampoo
- 1 Deodorant
- 1 1 gal resealable plastic bag.

Each kit will also include \$2.00 in cash for the purchase of a razor and toothpaste. The professional shoppers of the Mission Team will make the purchases (they have the specific instructions on what size and type of item to buy), and we will have a time later in the spring to put the kits together after church some Sunday.

We seek to be a place where all God's children, of all ages and abilities, can grow together in knowledge and faith, through study, through participation in worship, and through service to others.

### Prayer Intelligences

Every teacher knows that different people learn differently. One person can learn by sitting still and taking notes on a lecture; another gets antsy and needs to move. One person learns best in a group discussion; another does better going off with a book by herself. Trying to force everyone in a group to learn the same way is only going to leave some people out. The educational theorist Howard Gardner (see p. 1) breaks learning intelligences down into 8 general categories, which he calls:

- Verbal-Linguistic
- Logical-Mathematic
- Visual-Spatial
- Musical-Rhythmic
- Bodily-Kinesthetic
- Naturalist
- Intrapersonal
- Interpersonal

What if our prayer lives could be considered around the same categories? What if we've been trying to make people pray all in the same way, and just as in education, that has only been leaving some people out. That at least is the argument of Sister Caroljean Willie, a nun with a doctorate in education, who has written a workbook called *Praying All Ways: A Multiple Intelligences Approach to Prayer.* 

That workbook will be the basis of our conversations on Wednesdays in Lent (February 21 - March 20). Come join us for a simple meal, beginning at 5pm in the Fellowship Hall, with a guided mealtime conversation on what might be the best way for each of us to pray.

In January, our children began their New Testament unit in the Book of Acts, which tells the story of the early church in the years after Jesus rose from the grave and returned to the Father.



### Introduction to Amplify Media

Pastor Jerry



One of the traditional businesses that is trying to rediscover itself in the digital world is publishing. There is still – and for the foreseeable future will remain – a market for printed books, but now that has to be augmented by e-books to be downloaded on phones and tablets and e-readers. Moreover, as the video streaming world has changed the entertainment industry, publishers are scrambling to figure out how to use more video to promote and augment their books.

Cokesbury, the United Methodist Publishing House (including the Abingdon Books imprint), has been doing this for a while. Many of the books that they publish are intended as adult book studies, and so they have offered video companions to their studies. An author – for instance, the ubiquitous Adam Hamilton – records a ten minute introduction to each chapter, to be used at the beginning of each class gathering, to prompt discussion.

Now Cokesbury has taken another huge step. They have begun their own streaming service, sort of like a Methodist Netflix, called Amplify Media (I suppose Methflix was ruled out). This service includes not only the study-book related videos mentioned above, but also a large collection of Children's Bible videos both for use in children's classes but also for use by families at home.

And here's one difference between Amplify and Netflix. While Netflix is trying to crack down on account sharing, Amplify encourages it. The idea is for a church to purchase an account and then share access to that account with as many people in the congregation as possible. An Amplify account is supposed to belong to the whole congregation, so that people can use the videos in home study or entertainment as well as in church groups.

Lake Street's Communications Team has approved a one-year trial run with Amplify. We have the most basic level, and even at that level we are permitted to share access to 100 different people. If you think you might be interested begin by looking at Amplify Media (the website is **amplifymedia.com**) to see if there is anything there you or your family might use. If you are interested, simply contact either Pastor Jerry or Aaron Athas for the church access code.

And if we use up all our 100 accounts, that will simply be a sign that this is working, and we'll add more. Take a look.

### **RESOURCES FOR MINISTRY**

### **End-of-Year Financial Report for 2023**

As we had hoped, your giving was beyond generous in December, helping to erase nearly half of the deficit that we had at the end of November. We did still end with a deficit of \$18,000, and if you subtract from that number the \$7500 that was transferred to our Operating Fund from our Parsonage Investment Fund, the actual deficit is about \$10,500. (Because this money, designated for Clergy Housing Allowance, is an internal transfer, it is not counted as income.)

This is not to minimize the fact that we ended the year with a deficit. That is a concern, and an even greater concern is to look at the long term trends and note that our giving and budgets continue to grow smaller. This year we have cut an unfilled staff position from our budget at least partly because we recognize that even if we could afford that position now, we cannot plan of being able to do so for long.

But, by the measure that matters most to a church, we are still in good shape: we have the resources not only to support our current ministry but to look for new ways to serve others in the name of Christ. Our cash reserves remain strong (over \$200,000), and we have annual grants from the Lake Street Foundation to support new ministry efforts and special needs. Our congregation continues to give generously both to our budget and to special missions offerings. Lake Street is solid and financially stable.

And so, as always, thank you.

## Lake Street Hosts Bishop's Clergy Day Out Thursday, February 15, 10am - 3pm

Every winter, Bishop Hee Soo Jung, of the Wisconsin United Methodist Conference calls all the clergy of the conference together for a time of worship, a time of fellowship, and a time of talking through some of the issues facing the conference. (For instance, for the past two years at these meetings, Bishop Jung and the cabinet have talked about the long disaffiliation process that some of our churches were considering.) This year, as Bishop Jung completes his third and final four-year term as our bishop, and as the Wisconsin Conference prepares to share a bishop and some services with the Northern Illinois Conference, there are new questions and issues to deal with, so once again, Bishop Jung has called all the clergy for a time together.

This year he is holding two such meetings—one on the eastern side of the state and one on the western side—and he has asked if we would host the one on the western side. So, Lake Street will be welcoming between 100-150 clergy on Thursday, February 15. This involves physical welcoming, helping serve coffee and donuts as people arrive, and serving lunch. The conference is covering all expenses, and we will be serving pre-boxed sandwich lunches from the HyVee deli, so the work involved is not as much as it could be, but there will still be some work.

If you're interested in hanging out with a group of party animals for a day of adventures and outrageous hijinks on February 15, you probably should look elsewhere, but if you'd like to be a part of our United Methodist connection—maybe even catching up with some old friends—we could use some volunteers, especially around the lunch hour. Call the office or contact Pastor Jerry individually if you are willing.
