What I Did on My Summer Sabbatical

You ever have to write those "What I did on my summer vacation" essays in your first week back at school? Didn't you hate those? Anyway, here's my report.

First, thank you. I didn't think I was approaching ministry burn-out or anything like that; I just heard that I was eligible for this "renewal leave" thing and thought it would be a good thing to keep me in my healthy, non-burnt-out state, which I obviously was in. And about three weeks into June, Rebecca said to me: "You know, you're a different person now than you were a month ago." I was calmer, listened better, laughed more. Huh.

My goals in beginning this three months away were:

- Rest. Sabbath. A chance to do things slowly and deliberately and enjoy them more.
- Reading. Partly I wanted to read things just for fun, but I also wanted to read some of the academic books of philosophy and history and theology that had been piling up – books for my mind, not just for my ministry.
- Writing. I love to write fiction. It has been both a hobby and a side-career for me, but I haven't had time to do much with it for the past 15 years, since I became full-time in the pastorate.

Let me start with those. Yes, I rested. I got more exercise, spent more time reading (and doing crossword puzzles). During the times that was actually here in town, I spent much of every day under an umbrella on our back deck. Second: yes, I read. A lot. I finished several books of philosophy and theology, which you'll hear pieces of in sermons for some time. (Sorry about that.) And third: yes, I wrote a novel. (No, you can't read it – at least not yet. I've started the process of sending it out for publication.)

But one of the great benefits I obtained that I didn't have on my list of goals was perspective. When you are in the middle of a job day in and day out, you can get pretty good at those details, but you can also lose the bigger picture. Is this weekly task actually worth doing? Am I spending too long on less important parts of my job? Too little time on things that matter more? Now, as I prepare to head back to the office, I have begun to sort these impressions and to ask myself what I have learned? What did I miss from Lake Street while I was gone? I missed MAP, the youth class, and our prayer time together in worship. I even – and this will come as a shock to most of you – missed (some) meetings. When a meeting starts with a question, proceeds with laughter and conversation, and ends with a plan, that is a satisfying experience. What did I not miss? Denominational deadlines, the clutter of the email inbox, and the pressure of stage-managing Sunday worship.

Let me conclude with that last line as a paradigm example. I have always worked hard to keep everything running smoothly on Sunday morning, making sure everyone knows their cues, that nothing runs overtime, and so on. I don't necessarily feel that we have to end within an hour each week (well, obviously) but

if we run over, I want to make sure it was for a good reason. If things go off script, I get stressed and frustrated. But one discipline I imposed on myself for this sabbatical was that, when I wasn't on the road, I attended different churches. In that process, I had a sort of epiphany. Those churches I visited where everything went like clockwork were invariably the least meaningful to me. Those churches (especially the small country ones) where nobody worried about stage-managing felt much more welcoming and loving. I'm still mulling what this means for me and my Sunday preparation, but at the very least it means I shouldn't stress about late entrances and so on. We aren't there for the show.

I'll have a lot more reflections from my time away, and you'll probably hear about them, but for now, let me just say again: Thank you for the opportunity you gave me to spend that time in reflection.

Music Leadership Changes

Here's where we were at the end of May. Our long-time choir director David Fehr had retired, and those choirs were being led by Kathy Amundson-Forsberg and Evan Rognholt from our congregation. The Staff-Parish committee had begun a community-wide search for a new choir director. Meanwhile, our long-time pianist and accompanist Jennifer Lohmann had been accepted to a graduate program in Georgia. She left Eau Claire at the beginning of August. A lot of change.

Here's where we are now (or at least at the middle of August). We have not had any applications from the community for the director's position, and so we go into the fall in much the same way we began the summer. Kathy will remain the director of Ellesi; Evan will continue as Handbell director; the contemporary group Celebration will continue to lead themselves, and the other choir positions will be divvied up internally. SPRC will keep the job posting open. For the time being, we will continue working with the talents and giftedness of our home-grown musicians.

Given these changes, our choir schedule on Sundays and perhaps also our Wednesday evening rehearsal schedule will be changing. Musicians, keep an eye on our weekly Connections and Short Circuit announcement pages.

But we have better news regarding the piano/accompanist position. We have had several different applications for that role, and as of this writing (August 19), Staff-Parish is interviewing and auditioning those applicants. I look forward to introducing you to a new pianist soon.

Monthly Mission Offering -- Feed My People

This month the Mission team is asking you to help support the Feed My People Food Bank. The mission of the Feed My People Food Bank is that no one in their 14-county service area should go hungry. They believe that "food makes it possible for kids to learn, for adults to focus better at work, and for seniors to stay healthy and active." To accomplish this, they annually distribute 8 million pounds of food, and help to provide food to over 75,000 individuals. There are 255,297 annual visits by kids to receive food. Food insecurity for families and individuals continues to be a struggle please consider donating this month to the Feed My People Foodbank. 



# **Trustees Report**

One of the busy seasons for our Board of Trustees is the summer, but a short-staffed office this season, you may not know all the things that they have been up to. Here is a (probably incomplete) list of how your Trustees have been caring for your church building.

**Windows.** So much work on windows. First the windows in the downstairs chapel were sanded and repainted - for the first time in at least a decade. Next, the interior of the windows in the Fellowship Hall were refinished. Thank you to Glenn Bryson for so much time spent on these projects. Now the big one. Section by section we are going to put newer and more energy efficient windows in our education wing. The first step is the main (middle) floor, as all the windows in Rooms 201-203 are being swapped out, to be paid for by part of this year's Foundation Grant.

**Preparation for Kairos Homeschool Community.** As you probably know, we are the new home of a community homeschool co-op. (And if you don't know about this, see the article on p. 10.) On Fridays will be using the second and third floor education wing rooms, as well as the Dockside Room (under the sanctuary) and some of the downstairs youth rooms. This required a *lot* of preparation this summer. To be clear, the Kairos team did a great deal of the work, but the Trustees had a lot to do as well. In particular, they disposed of old and broken furniture, steam cleaned much of the building, including (shudder) the Dockside Room carpet. Special thanks to Randy Espie for all the hours he put in on that project.


**Platform Access to the Bell Tower.** This one takes some explaining. To get to our Bell Tower (and also to the crawlspace over the sanctuary), it has been necessary to bring an extension ladder and climb some 18 feet up to a trapdoor in the northwest stairwell. No one really wants to do that. For at

least four years we have been batting around ideas for how to make that trapdoor less harrowing to enter. Finally—having looked at spiral stairs, stairs that fold out from the wall, really bouncy trampolines, and jet-packs—Glenn Bryson designed a better option. Using donated materials and our own labor, we built the platform at the right. Yes, you can still walk safely underneath the platform, unless you are Giannis Antetokounmpo. From the platform, there is a short and stable ladder to the trapdoor.

**Fixed handrail.** There have also been the usual minor repairs, most of which come and go without much notice, but here's a sample: one of the handrails going up the steps from Lake Street to the sanctuary broke. It's fixed now.

# Financial Report, through July, 2025

We had another good month of solid giving and careful expenditures in the month of July. Your giving was \$3,000 over budget, and our expenses stayed right at budget. We continue to be under budget on utilities and maintenance expense, largely because of the time and labor put in by our Board of Trustees (see opposite page).

The two good months of giving in June and July are already starting to level out the surprisingly lean month of May. At the end of May, we were \$32,000 in the red, considerably worse than budget, but as of the end of July, we are \$27,000 in the red, some \$2,000 better than budget.

After 25 years as a pastor, I have concluded that I am utterly inept at guessing which months will be good giving months and which ones will not. The only thing I have learned for sure is that I should never be surprised when Lake Street givers give more than expected. As always, thank you.

# **Welcome to Kairos Homeschool Community**



Over the past several years, we have worked intentionally to make our church not just a safe and affirming place for our own members but for others in the community. We host multiple recovery groups, support groups, and classes. We have become a go-to location for special events from the YMCA and the ADRC.

Most of these groups are designed to support those in crisis: addictions, recoveries, illnesses, medical or

cognitive challenges. Beginning next month we will be the host of another community group -- one working at the other end of the life cycle. We will be the location for a new group of local homeschooling families.

Now most of these families teach their children at home — that's kind of the definition of "homeschooling" -- but a group of these families is coming together to bring their children and resources to special classes that others will teach. On the first three Fridays of every month, they will gather in our church for Spanish, Karate, dance, music lessons and several others classes. Classes will be available for students through high school.

They will be using primarily the third floor classrooms in our education wing, which are currently unused, but also the Dockside Room (under the sanctuary), the library, room 202, and a few other spaces. They have signed a Building Use agreement with our Board of Trustees that gives them those spaces in return for a small building use fee and a cleaning commitment for the spaces that they use.

Our offices are closed on Fridays anyway, so this provides this group a safe and spacious place for teaching their children. Both the Church Council and the Trustees are excited about the opportunity to contribute to a new generation.
