THE BIG "THING"



Sunday School classes or Bible Study groups greatly contribute to the spiritual health and growth of individuals as well as churches. The Bible teaches us that biblical community is essential for the life of the follower and to the entire church. The research and general observation reveals to us the benefits of a strong Sunday School/Small Group ministry.

Bible Engagement

Healthy classes/groups study the Bible. Those who attend a group spend significantly more time reading and studying the Bible than those not in group or class. The number one factor in spiritual growth is regular Bible engagement.

Evangelistic Accountability

Healthy classes/groups look for opportunities to both show and tell the gospel to both those in and outside the group. When we are in the Word and it is in us, we cannot help but tell others the Good News of Christ.

Increased Retention

People who attend a class/group are five times more likely to stay connected to the church than those who only attend the worship service. People stick because of the relationships, but they also stay because they are more than likely involved in ministry.

Enhanced Discipleship

In a group people experience biblical influence. To see people grow they must weekly be in worship, in a small group/class, and doing ministry.

Better Stewardship

Giving has always been higher from among those that attend a class/group than from those that just attend worship. People give to things in which they are involved in and believe in their mission or purpose.

Multiplied Ministry

Care for others becomes a natural part of life for those in a group. They tend to shepherd one another because they have come to know and love one another.

At the Floyd County Baptist Association we believe in the value of Sunday School classes and Small Group Bible Studies! Every three months we conduct THE SUMMIT. It is a gathering for Sunday School (continued on pg. 2)

Research from Lifeway shows that classes/groups remain one of the most effective tools for disciple-making. In these classes/groups people learn how to pray, study the Bible, and serve others. People that

regularly attend class-group show an increased level of commitment to building their relationship with Christ and with others.

- * 63% of regular class/group attenders say they intentionally spend time with other believers in order to help them grow in their faith while only 22% of those not in a class/group say the same.
- * 73% of class/group attenders say they are intentionally putting their spiritual gifts to use serving God and helping others, compared to 42% of non-attenders.
- * Churchgoers who belong to a class/group are more likely to go to church at least four times a month (79%), and to read the Bible daily (28%).
- * Members of a class/group feel closer to God (69%), understand the Bible better (74%), trust God more (66%), and become more loving in their relationships (48%).



A Morning of Friends and Faith

Lee Strobel is returning to Rome as one of our speakers alongside Roman, Billy Moore. Moore is featured in Strobel's book "The Case for Faith". He was convicted of murder and sentenced to death in Georgia. Fortunately his story doesn't end there. After receiving Jesus as his personal savior, he spent the remaining 16 years ministering to others on death row. Hours before he was to be executed his sentence was commuted and ultimately he was freed. This is a powerful story of a man's redemption through God's grace and mercy.

Lee has been described in the *Washington Post* as "one of the evangelical community's most popular apologists." He was educated at the University of Missouri (Bachelor of Journalism degree) and Yale Law School (Master of Studies in Law degree). He was a journalist for fourteen years at *The Chicago Tribune* and other newspapers, winning Illinois' highest honors for both investigative reporting and public service journalism from *United Press International*.

After probing the evidence for Jesus for nearly two years, Lee became a Christian in 1981. He subsequently became a teaching pastor at three of America's largest churches and hosted the national network TV program *Faith Under Fire*. In addition, he taught First Amendment law at Roosevelt University and was Professor of Christian Thought at Houston Baptist University.

In 2017, Lee's spiritual journey was depicted in an award-winning motion picture, *The Case for Christ*, which showed in theaters around the world. The movie was on Netflix for three years. Lee won national awards for his books *The Case for Christ*, *The Case for Faith*, *The Case for a Creator*, and *The Case for Grace*. His latest books are *The Case for Miracles* and *The Case for Heaven*.

The Christian Post named Lee among the top evangelicals who had made an impact in 2017. He was selected as one of the thirty most influential Christian thinkers of the past two millennia in the 2019 book Faith Thinkers, written by Dr. Robert M. Bowman, Jr.


