News and Upcoming Events

Easter Special Offering – As is our tradition at St. Paul's, the offerings collected on Easter are sent beyond the walls of this church to provide help and hope to people in our community and around the globe. Please use the enclosed Easter Offering envelope, and make any checks payable to "St. Paul's UMC" with the words "Easter Offering" in the memo line. All other offerings, or donations toward yearly giving pledges, should be made using an envelope other than the Easter Offering envelope. You may also donate online at stpaulsk.org/giving. The Church Council has designated this year's beneficiaries as UMCOR - Ukraine Relief and the Hunger Ministry. Half of the Easter offering received today will go to The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) and their "International Disaster Response and Recovery" fund aiding communities in crisis in Ukraine and the refugees fleeing the war there. Through local partners on the ground and its own trained early responders, UMCOR moves quickly to provide aid, and can remain in a community for rebuilding work that goes well beyond the initial response. Half of the Easter offering will go to the St. Paul's Hunger Ministry efforts to feed 100+ families in the 20895 ZIP code each month, providing grocery bags of pantry staples and grocery store gift cards that enable recipients to purchase fresh produce, dairy, meat, and personal hygiene products. Through our partnership with Campus Kitchens, we also provide a monthly dinner and

baked goods, and we serve as the local partner for the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services Holiday Giving program. Thank you!
