

may be donated in the bins in the Narthex any time. Please remember that we can't distribute food past its "best by / sell by" date, and we don't take glass (it breaks!) or containers that are dirty or damaged. Financial donations marked for "Hunger Ministry" help us place bulk orders to make up the gap between what's donated and what's needed, plus we provide recipients with modest grocery store gift cards to enable them to buy dairy, meat, hygiene products, produce, or frozen foods we can't stock.
