Renovation News to Know – <u>Out of Service</u>: Parking lot areas closest to the church, the parking lot door, and nearby sidewalks are unavailable. The Octagon is closed. <u>This week</u>: Please use the front doors on Armory Ave. or the Office door on Mitchell St. to access the building for worship. Available restrooms include the Narthex (beside the cloak area), near Fellowship Hall, and the MultiPurpose wing.

Offices Closed During Renovation – We do plan to hold worship each Sunday in-person in the Sanctuary as regularly scheduled. However, for safety reasons, church offices will be <u>closed</u> on weekdays. Access to the building is by appointment only. Staff will flex hours on-site or work from home. Email is the best way to reach staff.
