- New: Care During a Shut-down We know that members of our St. Paul's community are facing extra challenges due to the current government shut-down. We want to remind everyone that grocery resources are available to members of St. Paul's, regardless of your ZIP code, on a short-term or ongoing basis. For needs that are outside of our own programs, we can often provide contact information for other organizations set up to provide assistance. - Today: Apple Sale Apples will be available for sale after church as supplies allow cash, check, or pay using the QR code with your mobile device. - Today: Grocery Donations Needed Please consider donating to St. Paul's year-round ministry to provide grocery resources for households in our ZIP code. With extra pressure on our government-backed safety-net systems and the current federal shut-down, we anticipate an increase in local need. While we accept donations of all non-perishables in good condition, here is our list of most-needed pantry staples: Box of breakfast cereal, Instant oatmeal, Canned Chicken Breast, Canned Tuna (or other fish), Peanut Butter, Soup, Rice, Beans, Pasta, Pasta Sauce in can or plastic jar, Canned

Vegetables, Fruit including applesauce in cans or plastic jars, Mac & Cheese, Shelf-stable cartons of milk, oat milk, or nut milk, Ground coffee, Cooking oil (vegetable oil, canola oil, etc.). Please remember, no items past their use by / sell by date, and no glass containers. (Glass breaks and creates a hazard.) Items may be placed in the bins in the Narthex near the office door. Financial donations marked for "Hunger Ministry" also help us provide recipients with grocery store gift cards, enabling them to buy fresh or frozen meat, dairy, produce, or hygiene products.
