The world seems destined to be sucked into a vortex of its own making, all the while each of us is trying to deal with our own individual chaos.

Has anyone had a "normal" day lately? You know, that day when the planets aligned and all went according to your plans? That day when the school didn't call, when no one got sick, when there was no traffic back-up, and there was no line at the grocery store?

As I write this I find myself in my own personal pit! This has been a week filled with "unexpecteds," none of which would I have desired. God and I have had some serious talks this week, more serious than our regular conversations, and even a tad bit louder.

But at least I could talk honestly with God.

Too often we are hesitant to let others see that we aren't holding it all together; that it's duct tape and spit keeping us from falling apart. Sometimes we don't even want God to see that we're not as holy as we try to be.... But have we forgotten? God already knows.

It has taken me a lifetime to learn that I can come clean with God. I can abandon the masks and pretense, I can let down the armor, I can let God see me as I prefer the world would not: as a regular human being just trying to keep it together, trying to get it right.

Beloved, I believe I am not alone. And if this sounds like you, welcome to the club! Be grateful that our God is a God who welcomes us in all of our "isness". Beloved, God is big enough to meet us in the places we find ourselves, if we are willing to stop hiding from God.

So on those days when you're feeling anything but holy, go to God; have a little talk with Jesus, and I guarantee you that you will be glad you did. The situation you're facing may not change, but you will!








"Courage" Wednesday Bible Study Continues

Wednesdays, November 1, 8, 15 4:00-5:00 PM by Zoom



New! Sipping Ministry Sign Up



Advent comes from the Latin word, adventus, meaning "coming." In the season of Advent, we prepare for the coming of Christ: the promised coming of the Messiah to the Jews, the coming of Jesus being born in Bethlehem, the promised return of the risen Christ in final victory, and the continual coming of Christ into the lives and hearts of believers. This year, Advent begins on Sunday, November 26, and ends on Christmas Eve.

Each of the resources listed below provides an opportunity to journey meaningfully through this season and prepare our hearts for the birth of Jesus and his message of peace.

- **Advent 2023:** This booklet offers daily devotions to help readers prepare for Christ's birth. Each day's reading includes a passage of Scripture, a short devotion, and a brief prayer or daily practice.
- **Those Who Dream:** Beginning with the first Sunday in Advent, this daily devotional follows the Revised Common Lectionary through Epiphany. Each day offers something new: commentary, poetry, visual art, coloring pages, journaling, and Sabbath prompts. As you walk through these day by day, may you dream alongside prophets and angels, Mary and the Magi. Together, may we seek God's dreams for our world.

Copies of both booklets, along with other Advent materials, will be available in the Narthex later this month. We hope these resources will be helpful to you in celebrating this glorious season at home.
