A Brief History of the Poinsettia

Poinsettia plants are a Christmas tradition throughout the U.S. and the world. Poinsettias are native to Central America, especially an area of southern Mexico where they flower during the winter. The Aztecs called them "cuetlaxochitl" and cultivated them for medicines and dyes. By the 17th century, Franciscan friars in Mexico were adorning church nativity scenes with the plants at Christmas time. The bright red flower became known as *La Flor de Nochebuena*, or "Flower of the Holy Night." The plants were introduced widely in the U.S. by Joel Robert Poinsett, the nation's first ambassador to Mexico (and from whom the plants get the name "Poinsettia"), and made a splash at the 1829 Philadelphia Flower Show. By the mid-twentieth century, the glowing red and white plants could be appreciated at Christmas everywhere in the U.S., from churches and homes to the televised Bob Hope Christmas Special.
