Dear Parents and Students,

Please read the following carefully because it contains important information about registering for Falls Creek.

- For students who register by Wednesday, May 29, 2019, the cost will be \$100.00 per student. If multiple students from the same household attend Falls Creek, the first student will be \$100.00 and each additional student will be \$50.00. After May 29, the cost for Falls Creek will be \$125.00, and there will not be a sibling discount. There will also not be any refunds for cancellations after May 29.
- Students will not be allowed to register for Falls Creek after Sunday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019. This deadline is a strict deadline in order for the church to complete camp registration.
- **NEW TO THIS YEAR:** For students who turn 18 years of age on or before Monday, June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Falls Creek requires these students to complete an adult background check in order to attend Falls Creek as a student.
- If your son or daughter will be at camp for less than three full and consecutive days, they will not be allowed to register. Students arriving late must arrive by Tuesday night in order to attend camp. Students leaving early may not leave before Friday morning in order to attend camp.
- There will be a parent camp information meeting at 6:00pm in the upstairs student building on Sunday, June 9, 2019. At that time, we will review the guideline and procedures for attending camp with the church. *You will be responsible for the information shared at that meeting, whether or not you attend the meeting.* One issue that we will discuss is the dress code for Falls Creek. Our church will follow the guidelines provided by Falls Creek. You are responsible for providing the proper clothing for your students.
- All sponsors who attend Falls Creek must pass a nation and state wide background check. All background checks at Immanuel Baptist Church are processed through Protect My Ministry.

# FALLS CREEK 101



Falls Creek is a unique camp in many ways:

- You select and rent your own cabin
- You bring your own cooks and food
- You cook meals in your cabin in your own kitchen
- You customize the mid-morning in-cabin Bible study, morning quiet time, recreation time, and evening cabin devotional for the unique needs of your group. Falls Creek programming provides Bible study materials for the in-cabin portions of your day along with multiple recreation options.

Falls Creek is both rustic and modern with many varieties of cabins, rough hills, state of the art technology in the services, and access to missionaries, with information on national and global mission opportunities.

Generally, the camp programming is for believers in the morning and lost students in the evening. Each week we typically host over 4,500 students. In most cabins, 15-20% of the students coming with their group are not believers. We understand these dynamics and are sensitive to the unique responsibility of hosting so many lost students each week.

Because of the generosity of Oklahoma Baptists, your registration fee is incredibly low, which allows more un-churched and lower income students to attend camp. You have access to one of the finest ropes courses in North America and some exhilarating zip lines at no additional cost. The camp-wide worship experiences in the mornings and evenings allow you to spend more time developing the other in-cabin times with your students.

## A DAY AT FALLS CREEK

Here is a brief explanation of what takes place at Falls Creek on a daily basis...

### **QUIET TIME: 8:40-9:00am**

This in-cabin time allows students to be alone with God. A short Quiet Time Guide based on the theme of the day will be provided for students in the student book, given to every church/person at on-site registration on Monday. The guide can be downloaded prior to camp (after May 1, 2019) at [www.skopos.org/resources](http://www.skopos.org/resources).

### **DAILY SPONSOR UPDATE 9:00-9:20am**

Falls Creek Program Staff will meet with at least one sponsor from each church for a short meeting and prayer time to give daily camp updates in Massey Chapel on the north side of the tabernacle.

### **MORNING WORSHIP SERVICES 9:30-10:50am**

Middle School and High School students will meet together in the tabernacle for SURGE, a time of high energy music and games, beginning at 9:30am (doors open at 9:10am). At 10:00am, Middle School students (those going into the 7th and 8th grades in the fall) will be dismissed to the Event Center for LAUNCH, their morning teaching time. High School graduates, as indicated by the NC on their wristbands, will also be dismissed and head to the Massey Chapel for Next Chapter (see [page 38](#)). The remaining High School students will remain in the tabernacle for their morning teaching time, JOURNEY. Please organize sponsors to have enough adults to supervise your middle school and high school students. All groups will be dismissed at 10:50am to return to their cabins for In-Cabin Bible study beginning at 11:15am.

### **IN-CABIN BIBLE STUDY 11:15am-12:00pm**

In-Cabin Bible study and challenge is a cornerstone of Falls Creek. Students should meet with their individual churches in their cabins. The teaching materials for the in-cabin Bible study, taught Tuesday through Friday are available in the Sponsor Essentials or online at [www.skopos.org/resources](http://www.skopos.org/resources). All churches are required to have Bible study in their cabin to participate at Falls Creek ([page 10](#)). *Unless pre-approved by the Falls Creek Program Director, all activities conducted by churches at this time are required to be inside your cabin and not out on the Falls Creek grounds. For pre-approval, contact Todd Sanders, Falls Creek Program Director at 405-942-3800 ext.4642.*

### **RECREATION 1:30-5:30pm**

Falls Creek provides more recreational options than any person or group could possibly do in a week. Churches may choose to participate in the recreational options available or they may design their own recreational program. Tournament recreation is held at the Riverfront Recreation Area with the exception of Ping-Pong, which will be held at the pavilion adjacent to SwiftSkate Park. ### **EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE 7:30-9:00pm**

The Evening Worship Service is the culmination service each evening. Energetic praise, preaching, and public invitation (Tuesday - Friday) make this service one of the signatures of the Falls Creek experience.

### **EVENING CABIN DEVOTIONAL 10:15pm**

In-Cabin devotionals, led by local church leadership, reflect the specific needs and issues of the youth group. A devotional guide is provided in the Sponsor Essentials or online at [www.skopos.org/resources](http://www.skopos.org/resources) as a resource to the group leaders needing devotional ideas or plans. Since students have late night activities from 8:45pm until 10:15pm, churches may, if they choose, begin their devotional time before 10:15pm. All groups must be in their cabin by 10:15pm. Small groups and family groups (without a sound system) may meet around their cabin (e.g. on the porch) until 11:45pm, unless the group causes a distraction to other cabins. After 11:45pm, all groups must be inside their own cabin.

# MISSIONS AT FALLS CREEK

## MISSION STRATEGY

The Falls Creek missions experience provides opportunities for students to understand the spiritual, physical, and social needs of their communities, the nation, and the world. At these sites students can explore numerous opportunities of service, and learn how they can share their faith at school, pray for the nations, and experience hands on mission mobilization activities. The Missions Village will be open afternoons, Tuesday through Friday and after evening service on Tuesday and Thursday. The Wynn Center for World Missions will be open afternoons Tuesday through Friday and after evening service on Tuesday and Thursday. The Missions Go Mobile, will be around camp in the afternoons engaging students in conversations about reaching their world for Jesus. All of our mission venues provide information about mission trips and endeavors around the world, including GoStudents.

## GOSTUDENTS

GoStudents stands for Global Oklahoma Students. GoStudents is a strategy to:

- Create awareness of unreached, unengaged people groups
- Equip for readiness by educating and training in the Gospel
- Go in obedience to be witnesses throughout the earth

GoStudents challenges students to be mobilized throughout Oklahoma, North America and internationally at one of the many locations each summer. GoStudents partners with ministry leaders, church planters, and missionaries from Oklahoma, the North American Mission Board (NAMB), the International Mission Board (IMB), and strategic BGCO partnerships. ## MISSIONS FORUM

A special missions forum will take place on Monday night at 8:45pm in the Massey Chapel. It will encourage students and youth workers to get involved in the great commission from their homes to the ends of the earth! We will be talking about local missions, campus ministry strategy, GoStudents mission trip opportunities for the summer of 2020, and answering general questions about being a missionary.

This will be a great event to help students and youth workers see the need for missions and respond.

## MISSION STAFF

Falls Creek will host at least two missionaries in the summer of 2019. Missionaries will be available at our mission sites, and they will lead individual cabin devotions when they are requested. You can schedule a cabin devotional time with one of our missionaries or summer staff during registration on Monday, or at one of the pre-camp regional preparation meetings, or by calling (405) 942-3000 ext. 4645.

## MY5 OFFERING

The MY5 offering will be received on Thursday evening. This year's offering will support those going on GoStudents mission projects and to our 2019 project, ONE COMMUNITY CENTER (see below). We are asking every person at camp to participate in the MY5 CHALLENGE, where each individual is asked to give at least \$5 to the offering.

**NEW IN 2019!** We are asking group leaders to collect their groups offering during the week and bring it to the evening service on Thursday to be given during the offering time. Offering envelopes will be provided for groups at registration. Our goal is to help group leaders know how their students are participating and to make a larger emphasis on giving to missions at Falls Creek.

Leaders, please encourage your students **IN YOUR PRE-CAMP INFORMATION** to come prepared to participate in the MY5 offering at Falls Creek. We also are encouraging groups to have a **MISSION MEAL NIGHT** some time during their week of camp. The idea is that groups prepare a very cheap meal (beans, rice, etc) and give the money they would have used for a good meal to the My5 offering. This could be a great overall theme night in your cabin! Please stress that the mission meal is in addition to each student giving \$5 for Thursday's offering, not in place of it. Feel free to come up with your own ideas before or during camp to raise additional funds for the My5 offering. We are excited about the possibilities for service and ministry made possible through this initiative!

## ONE COMMUNITY CENTER

God came in human flesh to live as one of us (John 1:14). Just as Jesus "moved into the neighborhood" to reach the world, as Christ's representatives, we are to carry out that same purpose. One of our goals with this year's mission offering is to purchase a new community center to breathe life into one of our Oklahoma mobile home communities. We will partner with our GoStudents Tulsa mission project partner, *Mobile Missions*, who will make sure the community center is used to meet needs and share the Gospel year round and for years to come! This year we are excited about reaching Oklahoma and letting our own mission teams be a part of the kingdom impact that will come out of what the individuals at Falls Creek give at this year's mission offering.

## MOVE WRISTBANDS

We have been called by Jesus to MOVE the Gospel into our communities and into our world (Acts 1:8). This summer in addition to the MY5 Offering for our ONE COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT, there will be MOVE wristbands for sell in the gift shop for \$5.00. Each person that purchases a MOVE wristband will have their name added to an art feature in the new community center. Please let your students know that we encourage them to buy a wristband in addition to giving to the MY5 challenge, not in place of it. Encourage your group to do their part to help move in the community center and sending the Gospel around the world!





# CODE OF CONDUCT FOR FALLS CREEK YOUTH CAMP WEEKS

## GENERAL PURPOSE

Falls Creek youth weeks are planned for students who have completed 6th through 12th grade. The code of conduct for Falls Creek is intended to assist the many diverse churches and students at camp to have a safe and enjoyable camp experience, while growing in their faith. Falls Creek is a Christian camp designed to help students and adults know and follow God, so the code of conduct prioritizes personal encouragement and issues related to a student's faith development in Jesus. ***Falls Creek does not condone or encourage any activity on grounds that would humiliate any camper, including initiation, hazing, and/or pranks. Furthermore, Falls Creek will not tolerate any activity that would harm any camper such as violence or abuse.***

## MODESTY/PDA

Believing that modesty extends beyond the dress code, Falls Creek asks that students refrain from PDA (Public Displays of Affection). Church sponsors should be diligent to communicate this guideline to their students.

## CURFEW

At 10:15pm, all students should be back at their cabin and should not be outside their cabin without a sponsor until after 6:30am. Groups are allowed to meet around the perimeter of their cabin during late night devotional times, but a sponsor should be with the group at all times and extra care should be taken so other groups are not disturbed. Groups/individuals must be inside their cabin by 11:45pm.

## VEHICLES

- Recreation vehicles for living or sleeping purposes are permitted only in designated areas and must register in advance with the Conference Center.
- Unnecessary and careless traffic is prohibited on Falls Creek grounds.
- Only Conference Center operated golf carts, utility carts, or low speed vehicles (LSVs) are permitted.
- Delivery trucks are not permitted during summer camp weeks except to supply Conference Center-owned concessions.
- All passengers must be seated in a vehicle according to its designated capacity—no passengers are allowed in pickup beds or in the back of vehicles with hatch doors raised.
- All cycles (uni-, bi-, or tri-) are prohibited on the grounds. Violation of this policy could result in confiscation of equipment. Motorcycles may only drive to and from the gate to their cabin or meeting place.

## CELL PHONES

Falls Creek asks that church leaders make determinations regarding their students' use and possession of cell phones. NOTE: The majority of group leaders limit the time students are allowed to use their cell phones each day in order to cause less distraction from the camp experience.

## CAMP REQUIREMENTS

- Students are required to attend both the Morning and Evening Worship Service each day.

- Sponsors from each church are responsible for enforcing the code of conduct and camp dress code for their entire group (students, sponsors, and guests) and for handling discipline issues within their group.
- Courtesy Crew will be on duty 24 hours per day. Courtesy Crew, when called upon, will assist the adult leadership of any cabin in dealing with discipline problems that may arise. Although the Courtesy Crew is specifically assigned to the duty of enforcement, all Falls Creek Staff members are authorized to enforce the code of conduct, dress code, and policies of the Conference Center. Please respect all Falls Creek Staff.
- Church groups must sit together at all worship services. If the group is too large to find a single location for everyone, the group should divide into smaller groups with adult sponsors in each group.
- All guests are required to show proof of registration or ID to enter or re-enter the Conference Center grounds. Day guests should leave grounds by midnight.

## CAMP PROHIBITIONS

- Students will not be permitted to leave the grounds unless accompanied by a sponsor.
- No bands or instrumental groups are allowed to perform outside their cabin walls, except for groups that are an official part of the weekly programming for the whole camp.
- Headset listening devices and sound systems may be used only inside cabins.
- Excessive volume from a cabin is not permitted since it can disturb other cabins. Please check with the Falls Creek office, located in the Jordan Welcome Center, if there is an issue.
- No product sales are allowed at Falls Creek unless they have secured a contract through the Conference Center.
- Use or possession of illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco of any type is not permitted on the grounds. This includes e-cigarettes or other facsimiles.
- The possession of offensive weapons of any sort is prohibited at Falls Creek. Falls Creek Baptist Conference Center reserves the right to perform a random drug and weapon search at any time and confiscate items that distract from the camp goals or that violate the code of conduct of the camp.
- Open flame items (other than grills) such as campfires, tiki torches, etc., are not permitted on grounds, unless prepared and supervised by the Conference Center.
- Pets/animals (other than service dogs), fireworks, rock throwing, water fighting, laser pointers, and shaving cream fights are prohibited on the grounds.
- Masks or any other disguise over the face cannot be worn by anyone outside of their cabin.
- For the safety of all guests, skates, roller-blades, and skateboards are permitted only in the SwiftSkate Park area and only at designated times.
- No wading or swimming is allowed in the creeks or lake unless there is a Falls Creek lifeguard present. No swimming/wading pools are allowed at cabins.
- No camera drones or remote controlled flying devices may be operated on grounds without expressed permission from the Director of Conference Centers and the Falls Creek Program Director.



# DRESS CODE FOR FALLS CREEK YOUTH WEEKS

## DRESS CODE

Churches participating in Falls Creek should fully communicate the dress code to students **BEFORE** they pack and arrive for camp. While we understand the desire for fashionable attire, we require you to wear modest clothing. Modesty is a biblical principle and helps keep people focused on the important things at camp (1 Timothy 2:9-10; 4:12).

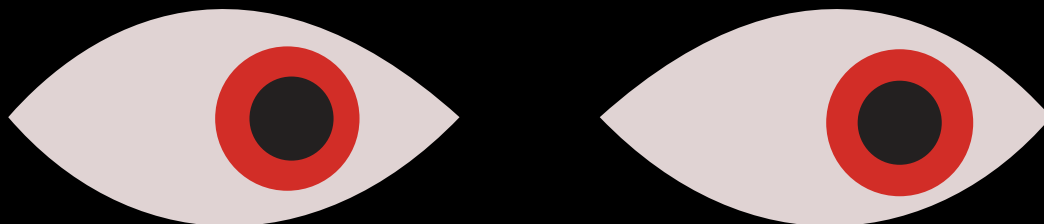
All apparel judgments will be left to the discretion of the Falls Creek Staff (FCS). If FCS determines a camper or campers should change their clothing to fall in line with camp requirements, then said camper or campers are required to do so.

## GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Shoes must be worn at all times outside of your cabin.
- Apparel may not display or promote tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances, or inappropriate language or pictures.
- Under garments must always be covered by out garments (i.e. No boxer shorts hanging out or bra straps showing).
- Midriffs should always be covered.
- No spaghetti strap shirts or dresses.
- No tank tops.
- No short shorts. At a minimum, shorts must extend to, or just beyond, the campers' finger tips.
- No tight fitting and revealing clothing. This includes leggings or similar attire, which cannot be worn as pants.
- Girls may wear dresses/skirts, but they must reach the top of the knee.

## SWIMMING

- Girls should wear modest one-piece swim suits. Males should not wear tight fitting swimming suits.
- While going to and from the swimming areas, all campers must wear shoes; males must wear a t-shirt and females must wear a long covering over their swimming suits.

# Falls Creek 2019 Student Release and Waiver of Claims Form (2 of 2)

## I understand that it is the responsibility of my child's Host Church to obtain insurance permission for treatment or to limit my child's recreational activities because of a stated medical condition.

My child, \_\_\_\_\_ will be attending Falls Creek during the summer session, 2019. Falls Creek Baptist Conference Center is managed and operated by the Baptist General Convention of Oklahoma ("BGCO"). In the event that my child should need emergency medical care or attention, the Host Church leadership, the BGCO or any of their agents or employees is hereby authorized to consent to the provision of such emergency medical care, including without limitation, medical, dental, surgical care, or hospitalization, to my child as is recommended or suggested by a physician, nurse, surgeon, or other health care professional.

• If such emergency care is provided, I understand that my child's health insurance information will be given to the health care professional and that any expenses not covered by my insurance shall be my responsibility. I understand that the Host Church or the BGCO will not be obligated to pay either the health care professional or me for any medical expenses incurred.

• There are instances when third party contractors are used to operate and supervise various events and activities. In those instances where third party contractors are used, I agree that neither the Host Church nor the BGCO is responsible for the action of these third party contractors. I further agree that neither the Host Church nor the BGCO is liable for the actions or activities of participants or sponsors participating in events or activities operated by third party contractors.

• I understand that the risk of injury from any recreational activity is significant, including, but not limited to, the potential for permanent paralysis and death. While particular rules, equipment, and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious injury does exist. I knowingly and freely assume all risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from negligence, and assume full responsibility for my child's participation in or observation of such recreational activity.

• Furthermore, in consideration of my child being allowed to attend Falls Creek camp, I, on behalf of myself and my child, hereby waive, and I hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Host Church, the BGCO, their agents or employees, against any and all causes of action, rights, claims or suits which I or my child may have against the Host Church, the BGCO, or their agents or employees as a result of injury to my child, including, but not limited to: (1) injuries arising from my child's participation in or observation of recreational activities at Falls Creek, and (2) injuries arising from the decision of the leadership of the Host Church, the BGCO, or any of their agents or employees to consent to the provision of emergency medical care to my child.
