Jump In

God called Moses in a dramatic way, by speaking from a burning bush. Moses could have walked on by the burning bush and missed God's call, but instead he was paying attention and chose to investigate. Moses was surprised God was choosing him. He began making excuses. "Who am I to go to Pharaoh and to bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" he asked God. After all, Moses had fled Egypt because he had killed an Egyptian. Yet God chose him for an important job. There was no doubt this call was meant for Moses—the voice from the burning bush called him by name. To reassure Moses, God promised him he would not be alone. Out of the flames of the bush came a reassuring promise, "I'll be with you." Most of us have never experienced God speaking to us from a burning bush. Help your children understand that God still communicates with us today. We hear God's voice when we help someone in need and when we love and care for others.

Dive Deeper Together

Read Exodus 2:11-3:22 Together

Moses grew up, and went out among the Hebrews—his people—and saw that they were slaves. Moses saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, and got very emotional. Moses killed the Egyptian and ran away to Midian. Moses became a shepherd. Many years went by, and the Hebrews were still slaves. They cried out to God, and God heard their cries. While Moses was taking care of his flock of sheep, he saw a bush in flames but the bush did not burn up! Moses checked out the bush, and heard God call out to him, "Moses! Moses! You are on holy ground. I have heard my people cry out. I will rescue them from Egypt. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people out of Egypt." But Moses said, "Who am I to do that?" God said, "I will be with you, Moses. You will save my people."

Grow Stronger Together

God calls all of us, though not usually through a burning bush. What is your family called to? Pick a ministry at your church to serve together.

Share joys and concerns, and then say this prayer: Dear God, thank you for always being with us. Amen.
