Reduce. Reuse. Recycle.

I'm just one person. Do my efforts really make all that much difference?

They DO. They REALLY DO! One bottle ... one can ... a single box ...they ALL matter. Choosing to recycle starts a chain reaction of positive acts! The results of a poll taken by The Recycling Partnership demonstrated that 84% of Americans believe recycling is an essential service, and 81% feel we're too wasteful. The top 5 reasons why people recycle? 1) To ensure that the world is inhabitable for future generations; 2) to make the world a better place or future generations; 3) to preserve natural resources; 4) to reduce carbon emissions; and 5) to minimize accumulation in landfills. It begins with each of us doing our part.

What does recycled stuff become?

- **Recycled paper** contributes to the creation of several products including paper, napkins, paper towels, and toilet paper. Paper can be recycled seven times.
- After being broken down and placed into recycling carts, **cardboard boxes** are made into new boxes within weeks.
- **Aluminum** is a very recyclable material which has no end-life. It can be recycled as many times as it is placed into a cart or bin, which saves both water and mined resources.
- **Plastics** can be recycled into new bottles, picnic tables, insulation, picture frames, clothes, carpet, and more.
- **Glass** does not degrade through the recycling process, so it's 100% recyclable. Recycled glass can become glass bottles, jugs — all sorts of things—and in rapid time. A recycled jar can be back on a store shelf as a new bottles within a matter of weeks.

What actually happens to the materials placed into recycling bins and carts?

The current US recycling system is designed to place empty, loose recyclable materials into recycling bins and carts through a system that sorts, breaks down, and uses those materials to create new products.

"Your community recycling programs and the businesses that rely on recycling do not want to see that material in a landfill," said Cody Marshall, Chief Community Strategy Officer for The Recycling Partnership, an organization dedicating to helping communities fully leverage their recycling opportunities. "Follow your local guidelines to figure out what is and is not recyclable and how to prepare your materials correctly."

But do manufacturers really use recycled material?

Absolutely they do! Big business and industry relies on recycled material. While this hasn't always been the case, big business and industry now relies on recycled material. The materials we as individual recyclers put in our bins eventually make their way back to packaging manufacturers and the consumer goods industry. It is a closed-loop system — just like the logo demonstrates!


