

Our Church History

The Four Tides of United Methodism

The book 200 Years of United Methodism: An Illustrated History tells us that the account of United Methodism over the years is "a human story, but also a divine story." Though the book was published in 1984, it covers what at that time were four tides (discernable movements) in the United Methodist faith.

The 1st Tide — The Tide of Pietism (1766-1783)

This tide was defined by seven specific points:

- The need for individuals to authentically, personally experience God
- The religious life being one of loving God and humans
- ♦ Testing the biblical message in day-to-day life
- Seeing the 'true church' as being an interdenominational community of God's people
- Having laity participate in all aspects of the Christian enterprise
- ♦ Training clergy to respond to the needs of the age
- The willingness to change church structures to meet new mission needs and occasions

Sound familiar? Though it may be hard to imagine, the basic tenets of United Methodism haven't changed a whole lot in 257 years! Originating in England, the waters of United Methodism "continued to wash North America with new spiritual life" in places like New York City and Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.
