New <u>Daytime</u> Alpha Course to begin Thursday, August 31 with Taste of Alpha!


You've heard a lot about how God has used the Alpha Course to touch many hearts in our church and community. Now for the first time we are offering Alpha in the afternoon!






The 2022-2023







Our Church History

The Tide of Nationalism (1784—1860)

The settlers of the recently established United States were, in a word, feisty. As taken from 200 Years of United Methodism: An Illustrated History, "these citizens of a budding land bowed to no one." Evidently an English Methodist Bishop named Thomas Coke made a remark indicating that he thought himself superior to American-born preachers — to which one is reported to have replied, "We think ourselves equal to Doctor Coke and to Doctor Coke's king."

Following the Colonies' acquisition of independence, the very first denomination to organize itself as an American church as the Methodist Episcopal Church, which was founded in Baltimore, Maryland at the end of 1784. One contributing factor for this was that John Wesley insisted that his followers receive the sacraments of baptism and communion from Church of England priests. At the close of the Revolution, few such priests remained in America.

Joseph Pilmore, one of the first two preachers sent by Wesley to America, summed it up concisely: "The chief difficulty we labour under is want of Ordination and I believe we shall be obliged to procure it by some means or other." Some Methodist preachers in Virginia simply began to ordain one another. This gave Francis Asbury much angst. When he wrote to Wesley with his concerns, John dispatched Thomas Coke and Asbury to be joint superintendents, along with lay preachers Richard Whatcoat and Thomas Vasey, for ministry in American on September 1, 1784.

As Methodism continued to spread further west into the New World over the next 70-plus years, there were many conflicts to work out. For instance, some believed the establishment of seminaries was critically important. Yet one writer of the time couldn't understand how obvious it was that "three or seven years is too long a period to doom a pious youth to Christiaan theology."

But eventually, Methodist seminaries were established — first in New England in 1841, then in Evanston, Illinois in 1854. Stay tuned for our next installment, **The Tide of Idealism** (1866-1918).
